Count I. Murder 2nd Degree (565.021-001Y19840903.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the **Class A Felony of Murder in the Second Degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about March 28, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly caused the death of Joseph Corum by shooting him.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served. The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the **Felony of Armed Criminal Action**, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about March 28, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Murder in the Second Degree charged in Count I, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Murder in the Second Degree by, with and

through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five (5) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count III. Tampering With Motor Vehicle - 1st Degree (569.080-002Y20172902.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 569.080.1(2), RSMo, committed the **Class D Felony of Tampering in the First Degree**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about March 28, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly and without the consent of the owner unlawfully operated a Chrysler Town and Country van, an automobile.

The range of punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than two (2) years and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Stated Lowrey had been driving a white minivan with a loud exhaust and provided a photograph from her surveillance system of Lowrey sitting in the driver's seat of a white Chrysler minivan. also provided a picture of the license on the van which was KJ8F8P, Mo. Stated Lowrey has a tattoo of 5 "tally marks" near his right eye which he stated was a "body count."
was able to send a general location of where Lowrey's phone was located which was in the area 32 nd and Walrond. On 03-30-2019, at approximately 2030 hours, officers responded to the area of 32 nd and Walrond and observed a white Chrysler Town and Country Minivan, L#KJ8F8P, Mo, parked along the street. The minivan was towed to the City Tow Lot for processing. A check of the VIN revealed the minvan to be stolen. (19-13618)
A court order had been obtained to track Lowrey's cellphone and also provided historical cellphone tracking data. The historical data showed on 03-28-2019, at approximately 0247 through 0300 hours, Lowrey's cell phone was pinging off the cell tower, located at 23 rd and Topping, towards the direction where the homicide occurred. Surveillance video showed the white van travelling north on Lister then turning east on 24 th street. The van continued east on 24 th street eventually crossing Hardesty where it continued eastbound until it went out of view.
On 04-18-2019, at 0550 hours, Lowrey was arrested and transported to the South Patrol Division for questioning. Lowrey was advised of his Miranda Rights which he refused to answer whether he understood his rights. A Search Warrant was obtained and a buccal swab was obtained from Lowrey. During my interaction with Lowrey I observed him to have 6 "tally marks" tattooed under his right eye.
During the processing of the crime scene several 30/30 spent shell casings were recovered and swabbed for DNA. A DNA profile was developed and matched to Lowrey. The genetic profile is 32 quintillion times more likely to be observed if Lorwey is a contributor to this sample than if an unknown individual is the contributor.
