The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 8/16/2017 Kansas City, Mo Police Officers were dispatched at 1637 hours to Cliff Drive and Chestnut on a dead body. Upon arrival they found the victim's body lying in the grass beside the roadway. EMS responded to the scene and pronounced the victim dead on arrival.

The scene is located in an area just off the north edge of Cliff Drive and east of the Chestnut Traffic way overpass. Preliminary observations of the body at the scene revealed the victim to have injuries consistent with blunt trauma, stab wounds and gunshot wounds. It appeared the body had been transported from another location and dumped at the scene.

On 8/17/2017 the Jackson County Medical Examiner ruled the victim's death a homicide.

On 8/17/2017, while attempting to locate the next of kin for the victim, detectives with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department made contact with with the Was a good friend of the victim and that he had been staying with her. She stated she last saw the victim on Monday, August 14th, 2017 when she dropped him off at the Quick Trip at 435 and 24 Hwy. She informed detectives that the victim's grandmother lived at 301 N. Quincy, Kansas City, Jackson County Missouri. Priscilla Quinones and WM, 10/23/1983 are a couple who are identified as husband and wife and have several children in common.

On 08/17/17, detectives responded to 301 N. Quincy where they contacted the victim's grandmother and his aunt. They were unaware of the victim's death and reportedly had not seen him in recent days. They were unable to recall the specific date when they last saw him and stated that at the time, he left their residence riding with "a car load of Mexicans". They advised that the victim occasionally stayed with them but he didn't have a home.

On 08/23/17, Independence Missouri Police Detective Todd Winborn contacted the KCPD Homicide Unit with information received from an anonymous tipster. The tipster advised they had information on a homicide that occurred at the second residence located near Blue Ridge Blvd and Lexington Avenue in Independence, Jackson County Missouri. The tipster advised that on 08/16/17, a white male victim had been bound, beaten, and stabbed while inside the residence and subsequently placed in the trunk of a blue car and transported from the scene.

More blood evidence was readily apparent on a white metal bed frame and a white plastic bag inside the basement. Luminol testing conducted inside the basement revealed the presence of blood on a white blanket located immediately inside the doorway, several items of clothing on the floor just south of the doorway, a large wooden table top that was turned on its side located near the aforementioned clothing, a wooden headboard near the wooden table, and a black wooden chair, also near the wooden table.
