COMPLAINT WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/from Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building, Resulting In Death Or Injury (571.030-015Y20145213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.030, RSMo, committed the **class A Felony of unlawful use of a weapon**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 571.030.9, RSMo, in that on or about September 26, 2019, at 2206 S. Cedar Avenue, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, knowingly discharged a firearm at a motor vehicle, Chevrolet Suburban, and as a result of the above described conduct, suffered injury.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section

571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about September 26, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of unlawful use of a weapon charged in Count One, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of unlawful use of a weapon by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five (5) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count III. Unlawful Possession Of A Firearm (571.070-001Y20175299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.070, RSMo, committed the **class D felony of unlawful possession of a firearm**, punishable under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about September 26, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly possessed a black Taurus PT111 Pro a firearm, and on May 2, 2018 the defendant was convicted of the felony of Assault second degree in the 16th Circuit Court Jackson County, Missouri.

The range of punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than two (2) years and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

Date: 9/27/2019 Report #: 2019-74752 I, Scott Mckee, a Detective with the Independence, Missouri, Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true. 1. I have probable cause to believe that on 9/26/2019, at 1430 hours, Maurice L. Webb, (Race-black, Sexmale, DOB- 04/30/1992, Address-4339 Mersington, Kansas City MO, 64130, . committed one or more criminal offenses in Jackson County, Missouri. 2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows: On 09/26/2019 Maurice L. Webb, herein referred to as **DEFENDANT**, fired a firearm into a moving vehicle, a black Chevy Suburban that was occupied by nine subjects (victims). One of the victims was five year old who was struck in the right arm by one of the bullets that entered the rear of the vehicle. This occurred in front of 2206 S. Cedar, Independence Missouri, Jackson County. On 09/26/2019 Independence Police Officers responded to 2206 S. Cedar in regards to a shooting and contacted the resident, reported that the incident began with a disturbance between her and her child's father, stated that came to her house and took their 18 month old child. stated that she thought had came over just to drop off belongings for , without her consent. , but her cousin had given him to in the front porch without her knowledge. said she attempted to grab . from as he began walking back to the vehicle he arrived in which was a black Chevy Suburban. Statistical said as she was trying to grab . It an unknown subject from the Suburban grabbed her from behind, choking and throwing her to the ground. said this allowed and the other occupants to get back into the Suburban. Significant said she was yelling for help her and that was when she witnessed the DEFENDANT who had been sleeping in his car in front of her house, get out of his vehicle and produce a handgun. Should told Officers at the scene that she yelled at to the **DEFENDANT** to shoot. Stated the **DEFENDANT** then began to fire several rounds into the rear of the Suburban as it was leaving NB towards 22nd Street. Ten (10) 9mm spent shell casings were located in the street in front of 2206 S. Cedar. The spent shell casings were recovered by IPD Crime Scene Technicians. Digital photos were also taken of the scene. As assisting Officers were responding to the call a black Chevy Suburban was located at 23rd St. and Maywood. It was determined that this was the vehicle involved in the incident at 2206 S. Cedar. The Suburban was stopped and the occupants (victims) were identified as; owner/driver age one, one year J age one, age 5. Officers were told one of the juvenile victims who was sitting in the middle of the third row was injured from a possible gunshot. Medical aid was given to the victim who had been shot in his right arm just above the elbow and he was later transported to Children's Mercy Hospital. Several fresh bullet holes were located on the rear of the Suburban and the back glass had been shattered. A statement was obtained from the driver of the Suburban victim stated he had given a ride to 2206 S. Cedar so he could pick up his son stated he stayed in the vehicle while gathered . from g cousin, he observed walking back to his vehicle with when he was then grabbed by tunning after trying to grab from him.
