Upon doing so she was told to stop the vehicle near two males that were walking, so they can tark to their friends. As she did so (Juvenile) fired a handgun out of the front passenger window. Baker fired a handgun out of the rear passenger window. Elder leaned out of the rear passenger window. She stated she heard several gunshots. She then stated Elder got back in the vehicle and uttered, "My gun jammed." She further stated they were shooting in the direction of the two males that were walking on the sidewalk. When asked if she knew what happened, she stated she heard one of the males was shot in the legand one was on life support. She stated she was told not to speak on what happened because she would get in trouble, they would know she talked and they have "people."

On 10-31-2019 during surveillance of <b>Baker</b> he was observed getting into a red Dodge. At approximately 1518 hours officers conducted car check of the red Dodge at 23rd and Sterling Avenue. Upon doing so (Juvenile) Larry <b>Baker</b> and Fields were occupying the vehicle. <b>Baker</b> was taken into custody on an unrelated warrant. (Juvenile) was escorted to Police Headquarters, 1125 Locust.
Witness driver of the red Dodge was brought to Police Headquarters by Detectives to provide a statement in regard to this investigation. Upon being advised of her Miranda rights stated she understood her rights and made the following statement: She drove Baker, B/M 08/07/2000 and (Juvenile) to 68th and Olive. Upon doing so she was told to stop the vehicle near two males that were walking, so they can talk to their friends. As she did so (Juvenile) fired a handgun out of the front passenger window. Baker fired a handgun out of the rear passenger window. leaned out of the rear passenger window. She stated she heard several gunshots. She then stated got back in the vehicle and uttered, "My gun jammed." She further stated they were shooting in the direction of the two males that were walking on the sidewalk. When asked if she knew what happened, she stated she heard one of the males was shot in the leg and one was on life support. She stated she was told not to speak on what happened because she would get in trouble, they would know she talked and they have "people."
(Juvenile) was informed of his Miranda Rights via the Juvenile Miranda by DJO Belcher. (Juvenile) declined to speak with detectives. (Juvenile) maternal aunt was also present.

The case Detective is requesting an arrest warrant in lieu of a summons for the listed offender as a firearm was used in this offense. "Baker" has had prior contacts with law enforcement Officers and is currently on Probation for "Theft from a

Person." In light of the recent incidents and his recent conduct the case Detective believes the offender is a danger to himself and the public.
