COMPLAINT WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Murder 1st Degree (565.020-001Y19840903.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.020, RSMo, committed the **class A felony of murder in the first degree** punishable upon conviction under Section 565.020, RSMo, in that on or about on or about June 21, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another or others, after deliberation, knowingly caused the death of Brent Barnes by shooting him, and defendant is further given notice that should the state submit murder in the second degree - felony under Section 565.021.1(2), it will be based on the death of Brent Barnes as a result of the perpetration of the class A felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon under Section 571.015, RSMo., committed by defendant.

The range of punishment for a Murder in the First degree is death or imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for life without eligibility of probation or parole, or release except by act of the governor. A person found guilty of murder in the first degree who was under the age of eighteen at the time of the commission of the offense shall be sentenced to a term of life without eligibility for probation or parole as provided in section 565.034, life imprisonment with eligibility for parole, or not less than thirty years and not to exceed forty years imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the **felony of armed criminal action**, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about June 21, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Murder in the First Degree charged in Count I, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Murder in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count III. Assault 1st Degree Or Attempt - Serious Physical Injury Or Special Victim (565.050-001Y19841304.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.050, RSMo, committed the **class A felony of assault in the first degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about June 21, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another or others, shot at the victim, and such conduct was a substantial step toward the commission of the offense of assault in the first degree of assault, and was done for the purpose of committing such assault, and in the course thereof inflicted serious physical injury on

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment. The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count IV. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the **felony of armed criminal action**, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about June 21, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Assault in the First Degree charged in Count III, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Assault in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count V. Assault 1st Degree Or Attempt (565.050-002Y19791399.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.050, RSMo, committed the **class B felony of assault in the first degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about June 21, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another or others, shot at the victim, and such conduct was a substantial step toward the commission of the offense of assault in the first degree of assault in the first degree of assault.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years.

Count VI. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the **felony of armed criminal action**, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about June 21, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Assault in the First Degree charged in Count V, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Assault in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count VII. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/from Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building, Resulting In Death Or Injury (571.030-015Y20145213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.030, RSMo, committed the **class A Felony of unlawful use of a weapon**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 571.030.9, RSMo, in that on or about June 21, 2019, at 84th Terr. and Paseo Blvd., in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another or others, knowingly shot a firearm at a motor vehicle, a dark green 1993 Jeep 4x4, and as a result of the above described conduct, suffered injury or death.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count VIII. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the **felony of armed criminal action**, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about June 21, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon charged in Count VII, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 06-21-2019 officers of the Kansas City Missouri Police Department were dispatched to Research Medical Center, 2316 Meyer Boulevard, on a reported shooting with multiple victims.

Upon their arrival, officers were informed the shooting occurred at 84th St. and Paseo Blvd / Martin Luther King Blvd, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. Additional officers responded to 84th St. and Paseo Blvd / Martin Luther King Blvd, where they located and secured the crime scene.

Detectives were notified that one of the victims succumbed to his injuries, a second victim was listed in critical condition, and the third was treated and released. Victim #4 was not injured as a result of the shooting. The Jackson County Medical Examiner ruled the death of the #1 victim as a Homicide, a result of multiple gunshot wounds. Fifteen .40 caliber shell casings were recovered from the scene.

Victim #2 stated he was with the other victims leaving 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. He further stated he was nervous leaving because the persons of 8401 Paseo kept watching them. He stated after they got into the vehicle to leave, they stopped at the stop sign. While at the stop sign a black male walked up to the vehicle and started shooting into the vehicle. Victim #2 suffered multiple gunshot wounds as a result of the shooting.

Victim #3 (stated he was at 8353 Paseo/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard with the other victims. He stated the four of them got into his vehicle to leave. He stated as they were at the stop sign he observed a black male walking southbound towards them. He stated the same male/suspect shot into the vehicle as they were leaving the stop sign turning northbound on Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

Victim #4 (stated she was at 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard with the other victims. They decided to leave and run an errand. She stated they were stopped at the stop sign when a black male approached and shot into the vehicle. She further stated she was not injured.

During this investigation detectives were able to locate and recover video surveillance of the shooting/homicide from witness #1. Upon reviewing the video surveillance:

At 17:16:27 the #1 victim arrives at 8353 Paseo via foot carrying a skateboard.

At 17:17:46 a maroon Chevrolet Impala is seen southbound on Paseo passing in front of 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

At 17:18:13 hours a maroon Chevrolet Impala can be seen stopped in front of 8401 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard (residence of a standard pase). An unknown black male is standing outside of the vehicle. As the maroon Chevrolet Impala leaves the address, northbound on Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, the driver later identified as a sobserved wearing what appeared to be a white or light-colored tank top. The front seat passenger appeared to be a black male, wearing a red baseball style cap and a white t-shirt.

At 17:18:58 a maroon Chevrolet is seen northbound on Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard passing in front of 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

At 17:27:01 victim #4 walks over to a male, later identified as He is on the front porch of 8401 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

At 17:25:57 hours victim #3-4 exit 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard and get into the victim vehicle. Victim #4 then gets into the victim vehicle. The #1 victim exits 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard and gets into the vehicle with victims #2-4. During this time is standing on the front porch of 8401 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

At 17:28:18 the #1 victim exits the rear of 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

At 17:28 25 the #2 victim exits 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

At 1730:04 hours the maroon colored Chevrolet Impala is observed westbound onto 84th Street approaching Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, passing the vehicle the victims were in. The maroon Chevrolet Impala turns northbound onto Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard then westbound onto 84th Street. The front seat passenger is seen wearing a red baseball style cap and a white t-shirt.

At 17:31:53 hours a black male was wearing a red baseball style cap, white t-shirt, with red with black sweatpants, is observed walking southbound in the direction of the victim vehicle, which was stopped at the stop sign at 84th and Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, facing westbound.

At 17:32:06 a black male wearing a red baseball cap, white t-shirt with red and black sweatpants, walks in front of 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard with a black object protruding from his right front pocket. The black male suspect has a goatee that extends beyond his chin.

At 17:32:15 hours a black male wearing a red baseball cap, white t-shirt with red and black sweatpants stops approximately six feet from the victim vehicle, retrieves a dark colored handgun, with what appears to be an extended magazine from his waistband. The suspect then begins shooting into the victim vehicle, as the vehicle turns northbound onto Paseo. The suspect continues shooting into the vehicle as the victim vehicle proceeds northbound on Paseo.

At 17:32:21 the suspect runs eastbound on 84th Street, before running south into the front yard of 1811 E. 84th Street.

At 17:32:37 hours witness #2 exits 8353 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

At 17:33:31 hours witness #2 is at 8401 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard talking with a male he identified as

At 17:34:29 hours the maroon Chevrolet Impala is northbound on Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard before stopping in front of 8401 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. A black male exits the front porch of the address and walks up to the Chevrolet Impala.

At 17:35:09 hours the Chevrolet Impala leaves 8401 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. It appears Aerian Bills is the sole occupant of the vehicle.

On 06-21-2019 witness #2 stated he was contacted by f 8401 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard immediately after the shooting. Witness #1 stated told him to delete the video surveillance footage because "those were his people."

On 06-22-2019 witness #3 contacted detectives reporting clothing on the back porch of her residence at 84th Street. CSI Tech Van Ryn responded and recovered the white t-shirt, red with black sweatpants, grey sweatpants and a red baseball style cap. The clothing recovered with the exception of the grey sweatpants appeared to be the same clothing as worn by the suspect in the surveillance video.

On 06-22-2019 during the investigation witness #4 stated he believed the shooting occurred due to the #1 victim being accused of a Robbery that resulted in the suspect's family member being injured.

The #4 witness stated he was given a description of the suspect of the homicide and recalled seeing a male at 8101 Brooklyn wearing similar clothing on 06-21-2019. He further stated the same male was in the rear seat of an older model maroon Chevrolet, with two unknown males looking for victim a days before the shooting. When asked what they wanted with the #1 victim, they informed the witness that they needed some work completed on an Impala. The witness stated the males had been looking for the victim for approximately a week.

The #4 witness was shown a lineup of six black males similar in appearance one of which was Daniel Bean B/M 11-25-1992. Upon viewing the line-up, the witness identified Bean as being the male he observed at an address on Brooklyn (with a two vehicle carport) wearing a red baseball style hat, white t-shirt with red and black sweatpants, the day before the homicide. The witness was shown a screenshot of the suspect vehicle, from the video surveillance, to which he identified the vehicle as the same color and style of vehicle that Bean was observed in with two unknown males. After the witness described the residence and carport, witness #4 was shown a Google photograph of 8101 Brooklyn, identifying the residence belonging to Bean's father.

On 06-22-2019 detectives contacted at 8401 Paseo Blvd / Martin Luther King Blvd. stated he was asleep at the time of the homicide and may have heard sounds of shots at approximately 1200 hours on 06-21-2019. Detectives noted was wearing a black t-shirt with a graphic design similar to the male on the front porch of his address prior to, during and after the shooting.

On 06-23-2019 detectives reviewed video surveillance at the Shamrock Gas Station, 1797 E. 85th Street. Upon reviewing the video for the time initially reported the robbery occurring, detectives observe the #1 victim standing in the parking lot of the gas station.

On 06-24-2019 during this investigation detectives contacted the reported victim of the Robbery-She stated she exited her vehicle to dance to a song on the radio, when a white male in a red plaid shirt tried to take something out of her vehicle. She stated they struggled during which time she was struck in the head with an unknown object. Stated she was in the area of 1333 E. 84th Street when the incident occurred. Stated she is engaged to this mother was later identified as of 8401 Paseo Boulevard/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard is brother
On 06-25-2019 the reporting detective received information the vehicle is possibly a 1977 Chevrolet and a cell phone picture was taken of the vehicle, approximately 3 weeks ago, while it was parked at the Napa Store, 720 E. 85th Street. A computer check of that vehicle's displayed license plate of LA1W2F Missouri for 2021, revealed it to be a 1979 Chevrolet Impala registered to Courtney Smith of Kansas City.
On 07-03-2019 at approximately 1339 hours Sgt. Dorothy observed a black Chevrolet Impala, bearing the same Missouri license plate of LA1W2F. Due to the vehicle fitting the description of the vehicle seen just prior to and immediately following the homicide, as well as the vehicle now a different color, Sgt. Dorothy initiated a car check of the vehicle. The driver, later identified as initially stopped the vehicle as he stuck his head out of the driver window. Then drove at what appeared to be excessive speeds and erratically for approximately four to five city blocks, before stopping in front of 1833 E. 84th Street. The exited the vehicle and ran in a southeasterly direction. Sgt. Dorothy initiated a foot pursuit, taking into custody just south of 85th and Wayne.
At 1935 hours was advised of his Miranda Rights via the Miranda Waiver. declined to speak with detectives.

The black 1979 Chevrolet Impala bearing Missouri license plate LA1W2F was towed to the city tow lot. Upon viewing the exterior of the vehicle, it was apparent the vehicle was previously maroon, due to areas of the vehicle were missed when painted. The vehicle was towed to the City of Kansas City Missouri Tow Lot located at 7750 E. Front Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. The vehicle has been in a secured facility since the vehicle towed.

On 07-03-2019 at 2316 officers observed Bean in the driveway of 8101 Brooklyn. Upon their approach Bean attempted to run, however was taken into custody without incident at 2318 hours. A 9mm handgun was recovered from Beans person at the time he was taken into custody. A computer check of the serial numbers on that handgun revealed it to be a reported stolen handgun out of Independence, Missouri.

On 07-04-2019 at 1410 hours Bean was escorted to an interview room. At 1411 hours Bean was advised of his Miranda Rights via the Miranda Waiver. Bean agreed to speak with detectives.

A search warrant was obtained for Bean's DNA for comparison to the recovered clothing from the rear porch of 1811 E. 84th Street.

Bean stated he was at home, 8101 Brooklyn on the date of the shooting. He further stated he no longer wears

baseball style caps and other people wear his clothes. He then stated the clothing worn by the suspect do not belong to him. Bean denied knowing of whom was in the photographs (still shots from the video surveillance). When asked what happens if his DNA is on the baseball cap, Bean responded, "Then I'm sitting here lying." Bean was shown several photographs, identifying Bean denied ever being the older model maroon Chevrolet or being involved the homicide. He also denied shooting at anyone or into any vehicle. Bean stated he has seen the older model maroon Chevrolet in the neighborhood. Bean did admit to having the firearm reported to be recovered from him at the time he was taken into custody. Per the Search Warrant Bean's buccal swab was obtained and recovered. On 07-05-2019 the reporting detective was notified by the Kansas City Police Crime Laboratory that the major DNA profile of Daniel Bean B/M 11-25-1992 matched in CODIS, to the recovered white t-shirt and red baseball style cap. On 07-08-2019 Smith was interviewed at her place of employment, US Bank, 6300 Troost. about the 1979 Chevrolet Impala registered to her. stated she still owns the vehicle; however her current regularly drives it. She further stated the last time she heard from was when he sent her a video of some work he did on the vehicle, however she could not tell what he had done due to the poor lighting on the video. On 07-09-2019 was taken into custody on unrelated charges. During his interview still shots from the video surveillance atted he did not recognize the suspect due to the photographs being too blurry. During questioning, stated his friend, Bean used to live at 8101 Brooklyn, however his family recently moved. When asked why they moved, they house got shot up". When asked whose house he was referring to, pointed to, while touching the still photograph (from the video surveillance of the suspect) and stated, "Danos." On 07-11-2019 responded to Police Headquarters to provide a statement in regard to the shooting into his residence at 8101 Brooklyn. During his interview was shown still shots from the video surveillance of the homicide with the following results: -A still shot from the video surveillance of the suspect walking southbound prior to the shooting-Upon viewing stated, "That's my boy. My son. Daniel." Adkinson provided a cell phone number of the photograph 816-651-0368 for Daniel Bean. Jpon viewing the photograph, identified him as "Bug" and -A single photograph of provided a cell phone number 816-885-8285. stated Bean and "Bug" are friends. -A still shot of the suspect vehicle related to the homicide-Upon viewing the photograph; stated he did not recognize the vehicle.
