The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 10/29/2010 at 7:41 p.m., Officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department responded to [Redacted] on a reported dead body. The victim, [Redacted] was found deceased inside [Redacted] residence. On 10/30/11 Jackson County Medical Examiner ruled the victim's death a homicide.

Investigation revealed the victim's residence to have no sign of forced entry. During an area canvas detectives found a witness who stated he had observed an unknown white male walking down the street from the victim's residence on the day of the Homicide. This male was seen by the witness to be talking on a cell phone and the witness observed the male walk to a newer model black Jeep. The witness met with a sketch artist and a composite sketch was completed of this unknown male.

The victim's body was processed and male DNA was recovered off the victim's body.

Detectives received information on a person who resembled the composite sketch. The person identified Moreland and further stated that they believed he owned a black Jeep.

On 06/16/2011 detectives attempted to obtain a DNA sample from Moreland at which time he refused. On 07/05/2011, detectives from the Harrisonville, Missouri Police Department responded to the Polk County Jail in Iowa where Moreland was being held regarding an offence from their city. At that time they obtained a search warrant and a buccal was taken from Moreland.

On 7/6/11 the Kansas City Regional Crime Lab processed the DNA buccal obtained from Moreland and found it to be a positive match for the unknown male DNA found on the deceased victim's body.
