# COMPLAINT WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Murder 2nd Degree (565.021-001Y19840903.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the **Class A Felony of Murder in the Second Degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about November 6, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly or with the purpose of causing serious physical injury to Michael K. Jones, caused the death of Michael K. Jones by shooting him.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

#### Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the **Felony of Armed Criminal Action**, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about November 6, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Murder in the Second

Degree charged in Count One, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Murder in the Second Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

On 11/06/2019 at 1507 hours, Officers of the Kansas City, MO Police Department were dispatched to 5314 Olive Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, on a report shooting. The calling party stated a man in a black truck shot another man who was standing at the truck window talking. The black truck was last seen driving westbound on 53rd Street.

Upon Detectives arrival, the victim, Michael Jones, was located in the street in front of 5248 Olive Street.


A search of surveillance video recovered from the area of 53rd Street and Park revealed a green Ford F-150 traveling westbound at 15:02:36 hours with the timestamp being 1 minute and 26 seconds slower than real time. In real time, the truck travels westbound on 53rd Street at 15:04:02 hours. The first 911 call is received at 15:05:03.

A TIP from Kansas City Crime Stoppers was received detailing the following: The suspect is Steve Grady B/M 40 years of age who lives at 3436 Benton Blvd. Steve Grady's grandmother lives at 5244 Olive Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. The tipster said the victim and the suspect were arguing over a female they were both involved in a relationship with. The tipster said the suspect is known to carry a .38 caliber revolver that may have been used. The tipster further advised Steve Grady's truck is dark green.

A computer check of "Steve Grady" responded back with a response of Ronnie Steven Grady B/M 05/09/1977 which revealed him to have operated a green, 2001 Ford F-150, VIN 1FTRX18L11NA65953 with a Missouri license plate of 0GC499. A computer check of the VIN revealed the 2001 Ford F-150 had an updated Missouri License plate of 2FDC36 and it responded back registered to Erika May of 3436 Benton Blvd, with a Transfer on Death to Ronnie S Grady.
