COMPLAINT WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Murder 1st Degree (565.020-001Y19840999.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.020, RSMo, committed the **class A felony of murder in the first degree** punishable upon conviction under Section 565.020, RSMo, in that on or about on or about April 6, 2020, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant after deliberation, knowingly caused the death of Felipe Carrillo by running him over with a car.

The range of punishment for a Murder in the First degree is death or imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for life without eligibility of probation or parole, or release except by act of the governor. A person found guilty of murder in the first degree who was under the age of eighteen at the time of the commission of the offense shall be sentenced to a term of life without eligibility for probation or parole as provided in section 565.034, life imprisonment with eligibility for parole, or not less than thirty years and not to exceed forty years imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section

571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about April 6, 2020, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Murder in the First Degree as charged in Count I, all allegations of which are incorporated here by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Murder in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a dangerous instrument.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five (5) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

Count III. Robbery - 1st Degree (570.023-001Y20171205.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 570.023, RSMo, committed the **class A felony of robbery in the first degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about April 6, 2020, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant forcibly stole a blue Jeep in the possession of Felipe Carrillo, and in the course thereof used a dangerous instrument against Felipe Carrillo.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count IV. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about April 6, 2020, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Robbery in the First Degree as charged in Count III, all allegations of which are incorporated here by reference, and the defendant

committed the foregoing felony of Robbery in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a dangerous instrument.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five (5) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

Witness stated that she was in the park with her mother when she observed a white male walk to a Jeep that was in the park and begin to talk to a white male sitting inside the Jeep. stated as they were talking it turned into an argument and then a physical altercation. She stated that after it became a physical altercation, the victim that was sitting in the Jeep got out and began running away. The suspect that had been standing outside then got into the Jeep and drove towards the victim and ran him over. stated that the Jeep then fled the scene and she lost sight of it. described the suspect as a white male, skinny, wearing khaki shorts, a grey tank top and an Italian hat.
Two witnesses responded back to the area of 23 St. and Topping Av. and advised they had occupied the vehicle that the suspect had entered after leaving the blue Jeep. Those witnesses, and stated that they observed a white male, taller than 6ft, skinny, wearing a white tank top, exit the driver's seat of the blue Jeep after it wrecked. and stopped their vehicle to check on the occupant of the wrecked vehicle. They stated that the suspect then ran to their vehicle, opened the back passenger door and got into their vehicle. The suspect demanded that they drive him home, which they did observed blood on the suspect and provided him with a wipe. When they arrived at the suspect's residence, the suspect exited the vehicle, taking shirt and black "Dominoes" hat, then walked into the residence carrying both items. Both and responded back to 23 St. and Topping Av. to contact police. Each was placed into an undercover and unmarked police vehicle at separate times and retraced the route the male provided them. Both witnesses advised police that they went westbound on 23 St., turned northbound on Hardesty Av., turned westbound on 17 St. and then turned northbound on Chelsea Av. Both witnesses pointed out 1638 Chelsea Av. Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri as the residence that the male exited their vehicle and entered.
Detectives responded to 1638 Chelsea Av. and contacted the witness and the suspect, who was taken into custody. The suspect was identified as Corey L. Darden W/M 10/23/1983. Darden was observed wearing black shorts and red t-shirt. While being taken into custody, Darden spontaneously uttered, "I have a confession, I wanted to kill a man today, but God told me I did not kill him, I only broke his leg."
stated that he and Darden live in 1638 Chelsea Av. tated that Darden frequently goes in and out of the residence, but due to extreme anxiety, rarely leaves his room. stated that approximately 40 minutes prior to police arrival at the residence, Darden woke him coming back into the residence. stated that Darden asked through the closed door, if he wanted to eat food. stated that he could hear Darden open spaghetti sauce, then go upstairs and start singing and playing music.
Detectives executed a search warrant for 1638 Chelsea Av. Detectives located a black "Dominoes" shirt on the bed, in the single upstairs room that described as Darden's. Detectives recovered multiple knives from the residence. In the trash can in Darden's room, detectives located a bloody-wipe.

Darden was transported to Police Headquarters. On 04/06/2020 at 2015 hours, Darden was advised of his rights via the Miranda warning and waiver. Darden stated that he understood his rights and was willing to speak with detectives. Darden stated that he went to the park at 23 St. and Topping Av. when he observed the victim's Jeep parked by a gazebo. Darden was drawn to the victim because the victim was alone and Darden liked Jeeps and wanted to take the victim's. Darden stated that he walked up to the victim and the victim had an attitude towards Darden. Darden stated that he pulled red switchblade knife and told the victim to get out. Darden stated that he

stabbed the victim once. Darden stated that he wanted the victim to move over, but the victim, "started to act tough," so Darden stabbed him in the stomach. The victim exited the Jeep and began to run through the park. Darden stated that he wanted to kill the victim, so he got into the Jeep and drove towards the victim, intentionally running him over. Darden stated he struck the victim a single time with the vehicle. Darden stated that the act made him feel, "great," because he did it for God and the woman he loved. After striking the victim with the car, Darden attempted to flee the scene at a high rate of speed but started to, "spin out," at a stop light and hit a rock. Darden ran out of the Jeep and contacted complete strangers in a small four door car. Darden stated that the strangers asked if he needed help and the female helped clean his hands. When shown a picture of the victim, Darden stated that he would do it again because the victim had, "evil" in his eyes.

Due to the extreme violent nature of the suspect's actions, the suspect's admission that he would willingly commit murder again, and the danger represented to the community if the suspect were to be released, the detective requests a warrant in lieu of a summons for the offender Darden.
