## Count I. Misuse Of Official Information By A Public Servant (576.050-001Y197573990)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 576.050, RSMo, committed the class A misdemeanor of misuse of official information, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011.1(5) and 560.016, RSMo, in that on or about July 7, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, a public servant at the time, acting either alone or purposefully in concert with another, knowingly obtained information from the Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System (MULES) for a purpose other than in connection with her official duties and performance of her job.

The range of punishment for a class A misdemeanor is imprisonment in the county jail or other authorized penal institution for a term not to exceed one (1) year; by a fine not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000); or by both

imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime up to a maximum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

#### **Count II. Tampering With Computer Data (569.095-002Y201029990)**

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 569.095, RSMo, committed the class A misdemeanor of tampering with computer data, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 560.016, RSMo, in that on or about July 7, 2019, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, acting either alone or purposefully in concert with another, knowingly and without authorization or without reasonable grounds to believe that she had such authorization, accessed a computer system, the Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System (MULES), and intentionally examined information about
