An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:	llows:			

On 08-23-2021 at 2001 hours officers of the Kansas City Missouri Police Department were dispatched to Independence Avenue and Garfield, as well as Independence Avenue and Paseo, on a reported shooting and subsequent vehicular accident.

Multiple calls for service were received regarding sounds of shots, a vehicle striking a pole and that vehicle eventually overturning.

The female driver, sole occupant of the overturned vehicle, was pronounced deceased at the scene. The Homicide 990 Squad was notified and responded to investigate. Two spent 9mm shell casings were recovered from the parking lot of the BP Gas Station (1900 Independence Ave).

The victim sustained an obvious injury to her right wrist and right upper chest. The Jackson County Medical Examiner ruled the victim's death as a homicide.

During this investigation information was received that the victim had posted a PlayStation 4 gaming console for sale on Facebook Marketplace. It was reported the victim was meeting an unknown party at the BP gas station on Independence Avenue and Paseo Boulevard to sell the gaming console. The victim was on the phone with her cousin during this incident.

Video surveillance was obtained from the BP Gas Station, 1900 Independence Avenue. Upon reviewing the video surveillance, it showed the victims white and red Mini Cooper arriving. The victim initially parks near the building before parking next to one of the fuel pumps. Two black male suspects approached her vehicle. Both approach the driver side. The driver window of the vehicle is rolled down and the suspect in the red hooded jacket stood near the driver door.

The victim opened the driver door at which time the suspect in the red hooded jacket struggled with the victim, as the second suspect wearing a black hooded jacket goes around to passenger side armed with a handgun. The victim drove away as the suspect in the black hooded jacket was near the front end of the victim's vehicle. The suspect in the black hooded jacket fired the handgun into the front windshield of the victim's vehicle. The same suspect appeared to fire a second time as the victim's vehicle exited the parking lot of the gas station. The victim drove away eastbound, eventually losing control of her vehicle, striking a utility pole before overturning.

Witnesses at the scene stated that they observed the victim's vehicle at the gas station, heard sounds of shots and observed the vehicle leaving the gas station at a high rate of speed before colliding with a tree and a pole, then overturning. None of the witnesses reported seeing the actual shooting. They also reported two younger black males, possibly teenagers, running northbound from the scene.

Detectives located the victim's advertisement for a Play Station 4 gaming console for sale on Facebook Marketplace. She was reportedly contacted by a Facebook user on Facebook Messenger where it was arranged to meet her at the location to purchase the gaming console which resulted in the homicide of the victim.

The reporting detective checked social media (Facebook) and located a user profile-Randie Smith. There are several photographs of the victim in the photos and post sections. That profile was identified as the victim's and the same she used to advertise the gaming system.

On 08-26-2021 the reporting detective was contacted by the victim's father, Tommie Smith, who provided the victims Facebook login information. Detectives utilized that information and logged into the victim's Facebook. Attention was directed to the victim's Facebook Market messages. The victim placed an ad on the Market Place for a PlayStation 4 for \$225. In the victim's messages, there were individuals who requested information on the PlayStation. On the day of the homicide, the victim received an inquiry for the PlayStation from, "Rick Fox" asking if the gaming console was available on the day of the homicide. The victim replied, 'yes', but there was no more communication. Another individual, "Mike Lawson", messaged the victim, also on the day of the homicide. In those messages Mike Lawson gives the address of the homicide as a meet up place to make the transaction. The victim describes her vehicle and gives updates on times and locations. The victim then tells Mike Lawson that she is at the pump. Mike Lawson stated he was, "coming from the ATM."

Upon searching FB friends of "Rick Fox" detectives located a FB friend with username, "Gbg Lul Head."

The FB user Rick Fox was determined to be Keron Black B/M 01-16-2003 of 491 Highland Avenue.

FB user "Rick Fox" and user "Gbg Lul Head" have photographs in the photos section of Keron Black.

Additionally, when detectives utilized the police report writing database it was observed that Keron Black was documented by law enforcement as an occupant of a blue Honda Accord with a Kansas temporary license of 05GPVD. Of interest, in the officer's body warn camera, the blue Honda had a front driver's side tire missing a hub cap, giving the wheel an all-black appearance.

I stated that once she received a reply she would let BLACK take over messaging. tated that she was the one who text the victim on Facebook prior to the homicide to set up a purchase of the PlayStation stated that she used the 'Rick Fox' Facebook page. I lenied having any knowledge of a robbery, and denied driving her Honda on the day of the homicide advised that BLACK asked to borrow her Honda so he could play basketball with "Nell (Raynell Muldrew-Golston)" and his brother stated the BLACK was gone for a long amount of time and at about 2200 or 2300 hours she began calling Nell's Facebook messenger to contact BLACK. BLACK answered the call and

stated that she knew that BLACK commits robberies, and the last robbery she was aware of was in January of 2021.

CRN 21-56170

confirmed that BLACK called her from the KCPD Detention Unit, and that BLACK told her that he was "taking a case" for me. denied knowing what BLACK meant by that. On 10-20-2021, detectives were advised by the Jackson County Court that BLACK requested to speak with detectives again. Detectives responded to the Jackson County Jail and transported him to Police Headquarters. BLACK was advised of his Miranda Warning and Wavier, to which he stated that he understood. BLACK stated drove the Honda to the robbery, that he (BLACK) made "the Facebook" for Raynell Muldrew-Golston and BLACK stated that he watched Raynell and BLACK stated that he ran with Raynell and BLACK stated that I ere not present. On 10-20-2021, MULDREW-GOLSTON, Raynell was arrested and booked into the East Patrol detention. Det. VanVickle and I responded to East Patrol detention and made contact with MULDREW-GOLSTON. MULDREW-GOLSTON was advised of his Miranda Warning and Wavier, to which he stated that he understood his rights. MULDREW-GOLSTON stated that vas driving "the vehicle" and that "they" set up the robbery. MULDREW-GOLSTON stated that he did something "dumb" because he was scared. Printed Name /s/ Det.
