Count I. Child Kidnapping (565.115-001Y20201099.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.115, RSMo, committed the class A felony of child kidnapping, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about February 13, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, who was not related within the third degree to blood or marriage, knowing the defendant had no right to do so, removed under the age of fourteen years, from the driveway of her home, and defendant removed without the consent of the child's parent or guardian.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Child Kidnapping (565.115-001Y20201099.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.115, RSMo, committed the class A felony of child kidnapping, punishable upon conviction under

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Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about February 13, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, who was not related within the third degree to by blood or marriage, knowing the defendant had no right to do so, removed , a child under the age of fourteen years, from the driveway of her home, and defendant removed without the consent of the child's parent or guardian.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count III. Tampering With Motor Vehicle - 1st Degree (569.080-002Y20202999.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 569.080.1(2), RSMo, committed the **class D felony of tampering in the first degree**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about February 13, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly and without the consent of the owner unlawfully operated an automobile, namely a red Ford Edge.

The range punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

While on scene CMS advised they were getting multiple calls about the amber alert. CMS later stated Independence PD located the vehicle and got it stopped in the area of 170 and Little Blue Pkwy in their city. At 1531 hours, the driver/defendant, Mitchell Green was taken into custody and the children were uninjured.
1551 hours, the driver/defendant, Mitchell Green was taken into custody and the children were uninjured.
PO Amyx escorted to the scene where he recovered his children.
Det. C. Albin contacted at the residence. She secured both of her kids inside their car seats inside her vehicle. She started the vehicle. She then remembered she needed more "wipes" and left her vehicle and entered her residence. The vehicle was still running when she entered her residence. As she was walking back to her vehicle she discovered that a male had entered her vehicle, in the driver seat,
and was starting to back her vehicle on the driveway toward the street. She ran toward the vehicle while yelling at the person inside her vehicle. The male drove off the driveway and onto Southwest Winterpark Circle. The male drove the vehicle away East on Southwest Winterpark Circle. She then called 911.
She provided the following information about the male that drove away in her vehicle: Sex: Male
Race: African American
Clothing: Dark colored "hoodie"
Pandemic mask: Colored pink or yellow
Hair: Short, curly, hair
Det. C. Albin recovered the Ring video from the residence.
Det. Mark Corbin and Det. Amy Ramsey interviewed the defendant. After reading aloud to him his Miranda Rights, the defendant stated that he would be willing to talk. The defendant stated the following: He believed the reason he was currently being detained was due to being pulled over while driving his Ford with his "kids". He added he was driving "minding my own business" and the "car got confiscated and the kids got taken". Investigators inquired about the name of his children. He stated "Jenna" and "Sonia". He corrected investigators pronunciation of "Jenna" to "Janya". Investigators asked the ages of his children. He stated Janya was a baby either seven or eight months of age. He said Sonia was about four of five years of age. Green was unable to provide the birthdays for either Sonia and Janya.
He provided the following timeline leading up to his arrest by law enforcement. He had slept in the lobby of a
hospice facility in Lee's Summit near the Target and Best Buy stores. After waking up, he began walking which included a stop at the Hy-Vee grocery store for food. He confirmed the Hy-Vee to be store located off Third Street. Following the stop, he walked to his children's mother. However, home located within two or three miles of the Hy-Vee. Once at the home, an argument ensued between them. He asked to use gave permission for him to use her vehicle. He and the children left the area in the car. He
remarked "of course" he knew his children were in the car.
He indicated he was going to drive to a yet to be determined location to purchase a blanket. During the drive, he said, Janya made statements of him making her scared and that her mother was not around. He said Janya was scaring her sister. In response, he put on some music. Additionally, he believed the children needed "Cheetos" or a snack food. Investigators questioned Janya being of age to verbally communicate. He then changed his initial statement to that of Janya was now the older of the two children
He recalled driving to a friend's home in Independence. He never contacted the friend named provided "Wyatt" and "Watt" as possible last name. He described not having a true destination but rather only a need to get out of Kansas City. He estimated he would have drove around for another 30 minutes

if not stopped by law enforcement. Investigators asked him if his plans were to drop Janya and Sonia back at home. He remarked, "I probably could've". Additionally, he admitted to not thinking about that at the moment. The defendant was confronted about the false statements regarding the children, purported mother and having permission to drive the vehicle. He admitted to taking the car. He knew the car was not his car. He did not see the children, when he got in the car. He commented the children were seen while he was driving. He admitted one of children was upset.

The defendant tried again to establish his timeline leading up to being arrested by law enforcement. He had slept in a Lee's Summit hospice lobby last night. He agreed walked to Hy-Vee. He next walked to a "recognized" neighborhood. He added the neighborhood was that of his baby momma and my true kids were at". He thought there was a possibility he was having a nervous breakdown. He agreed seeing a female and running vehicle. He greeted the woman. After entering the vehicle, he indicated of having thoughts of possibly driving to Columbia. He was asked if the children in the car were his children. He remarked "if you say the kids aren't mine then the kids aren't mine". He was asked if he knew the children were not his children. He stated, "lots of children are born".
