Count I. Leaving Scene Of Accident - Accident Resulting In Death (577.060-006Y20205401.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 577.060, RSMo, committed the **class D felony of leaving the scene of an accident**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 27, 2022, the defendant, while operating a motor vehicle on a highway located at or near Longview Road and View High Drive, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, was involved in an accident that resulted in death of Charles D Criniere, and the defendant knew that such accident had occurred, and the defendant left the place of the accident without stopping and giving defendant's name, residential address, and operator's license number to the nearest police station or judicial officer.

The range punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

State vs. Kyrie Fields

Count II. Tampering With Motor Vehicle - 1st Degree (569.080-002Y20202999.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 569.080.1(2), RSMo, committed the **class D felony of tampering in the first degree**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 558.002, RSMo, in that on or about August 27, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly and without the consent of the owner unlawfully operated a white Acura MDX, an automobile.

The range punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

Vehicular Manslaughter

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 08-27-2022 at 0617 hours, members of the Kansas City Missouri Police Department responded to View High Drive and Longview Road Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri on a reported fatal hit and run crash involving a bicycle.

Upon arrival officers located the victim deceased from being struck by an unknown vehicle, which fled the scene south on View High Drive. Vehicle parts from the suspect vehicle were recovered from the scene. During the course of the investigation, the vehicle was determined to be a white 2017 to a 2020 Acura MDX. A white Acura MDX was recovered by Grandview Missouri Police Department after the vehicle had been burned in an arson on 08-28-2022 at 13420 S. US 71 Highway Grandview Jackson County, Missouri. It was learned the vehicle had been towed from 2830 SW 10th Terrace Lee's Summit, Jackson County, Missouri after the alleged owners stated the vehicle had struck a deer. The vehicle was towed from 13420 S. US 71 Highway to 4100 Main Street Grandview, Jackson County, Missouri. Detectives responded to 4100 Main Street and matched the recovered car parts to the vehicle, which had been burned.

Detectives contacted a resident of 2830 SW 10th Terrace who was present when a **Kyrie H. Fields**, **WF**, 02-22-1995 drove the Acura MDX to the address along with a black male only known as "Lo". Fields advised the resident she had struck a deer and needed to put the vehicle in his garage. On 08-27-2022 at 2348 hours, a Santa Fe tow truck was ordered by Fields using the name Kimberly Banks and using the phone number of 608-707-2463. The tow truck dropped the vehicle off at 13420 S. US 71 Highway at 0130 hours, on 08-28-2022. On 08-28-2022 at 0645 hours, a male is seen arriving in a white Acura and setting the Acura MDX on fire. The resident of 2830 SW 10th Terrace had text messages and phone calls between his phone and Fields phone, to include a phone call just before and after the crash and text messages with the address of 13420 S. US 71 Highway at 0542 hours, on 08-28-2022 just prior to the Acura being set on fire. The resident stated the white Acura suspect vehicle in the arson case belongs to his mother. A second witness was located who was at 2830 SW 10th Terrace who verified Fields was the driver of the Acura MDX at the time of the crash. Video surveillance was obtained from the area prior to the crash confirming the suspect vehicle was a white Acura MDX.

A stop order was issued for Fields and she was arrested on 09-12-2022. Fields was transported to the Traffic Investigations Unit and interviewed. Prior to being interviewed, Fields was advised of her rights, per Miranda. Fields stated she understood her rights and agreed to be interviewed. Fields stated she was driving the white Acura MDX at the time of the crash and her boyfriend was in the passenger seat. She stated she assumed the vehicle was stolen and she had been in possession of the Acura for a few months. Fields stated she had texted her friend and told him she was on her way over prior to the crash. Fields stated as she was driving she took her eyes off the roadway and when she looked up she struck the victim on his bicycle. She stated the victim's blood got on her and on the front of the vehicle. She stated she drove to her friend's house in the area and backed the Acura in the garage, where Asad and her friend cleaned the car. Fields stated she was high on Percocet at the time of the crash. She stated once she got to her friend's house she used approximately

100 MG more of Percocet and does not remember calling a tow truck or talking to the tow truck driver. She

stated she was unsure who burned the Acura.
