Count I. Accessory Murder 2nd Degree (565.021-001Y20200903.2)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the **class A felony of murder in the second degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about August 19, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, acting alone or in concert with another, knowingly or with the purpose of causing serious physical injury to John L. Greer, caused the death of John L Greer by shooting him, and defendant is further given notice that should the state submit murder in the second degree - felony under Section 565.021.1(2), it will be based on the death of John L. Greer as a result of the perpetration of the class A felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon under Section 571.030, committed by defendant.

No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years.

The facts supporting this belief are as fo	llows:		

On 08-19-2022 at 2025 hours, Officers with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department were dispatched to **3534 Wayne Avenue, Jackson County, Missouri** on a reported shooting. Upon arrival, contact was made with two older black males on the front porch of the dispatched address. One of those males stated, "They went that way", referring to the suspects and pointed to the north. When asked where the victim was he stated, "He ran in the house". Upon making entry into the house, officers observed the victim, later identified as **John L Greer B/M 05-27-1999**, lying face down on the floor. Officers rolled the victim over, lifted his shirt and observed a single gunshot wound to the chest. Officers attempted lifesaving measures until EMS responded and transported the victim to TMC where he was later pronounced deceased.

Witnesses at the scene stated they heard two shots coming from the empty lot to the north of 3534 Wayne Avenue. After the shots were fired, several young black males, possibly juveniles, got into a black 2 door Chevrolet Monte Carlo and left the scene in a northbound direction. Officers located a PPU 10mm Auto spent shell casing in the grass of the empty lot. The shell casing was later recovered by responding Crime Scene Investigators who processed the scene.

Detectives from the 1030 Homicide Squad responded to the incident location and obtained Consent to Searches for the residence at 3534 Wayne and the empty lot which were both owned by the homeowner.

Detectives conducted an area canvas for surveillance footage at the time of the homicide and located several cameras on the Kansas City Public Safety Department Headquarters (KCPS), located at 3400 Highland Avenue. Contact was made with a KCPS dispatcher who granted Detectives access to the footage. Around the time of the original call for service (08-19-2022 at 2025 hours), the *Franklin S parking lot overview 13 camera* picks up

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a dark in color sedan traveling at a high rate of speed northbound on Wayne Avenue through 35th Street. The dark sedan continues northbound past the KCPS Security Department Headquarters building at 2023 hours. A second sedan is seen traveling at a high rate of speed through the same intersection and appeared to be following behind the black sedan.

Detectives then viewed the <u>Franklin Dock Intercom</u> which captures Wayne Avenue further to the north and observed what appeared to be a black 2-door sedan, followed by a 4-door sedan traveling north on Wayne Avenue until out of view. The listed chain of events were also captured on the <u>Franklin Wayne HVAC camera</u> as well. Detectives responded to the area of 33rd Street and Wayne Avenue and observed an exterior camera at 1601 E 33rd Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

Detectives made contact with the resident at Street who granted access to his surveillance footage. On 08-19-2022 at 2024 hours, the WYZE cameras facing northwest toward and Wayne captures what appears to be a black 2-door Chevrolet Monte Carlo (Description consistent with KCPS surveillance footage) arrive at the listed intersection. The Monte Carlo does not stop at the stop sign and turns eastbound onto 33rd Street. Moments later the 4-door sedan, which appears to be a dark gray Nissan, runs the stop sign and continues eastbound behind the Monte Carlo.

After identifying the black 2-door sedan as a Chevrolet Monte Carlo, Detectives began searching Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) along with Genetec cameras in the area of the homicide prior to and after the incident. The Monte Carlo was located on ALPR at 1744 hours on the incident date traveling eastbound on 35th Street and Woodland. However, the reader did not pick up the plate number at that time. A second ALPR hit at the same location (This time traveling westbound) was located on the incident date at 1805 hours. No plate was read on the hit but the photo was clear enough to identify a Missouri temporary tag of 063FLE. A computer check of the tag yielded not on file. Missouri Department of Revenue was contacted in regard to the tag and advised the plate was either altered or was a fake.

On 08-23-2022, Wit#1 reached out to Det. Gantt via phone and stated he needed to talk about the homicide of John Greer. Det. Gantt advised me that Wit#1 wanted to talk further about the incident so Det. Cook and I responded to his residence to speak with him in person. Upon arrival, we made contact with Wit#1 who stated he witnessed John's murder and wanted to come forward with what he saw that night. Wit#1 cited a lack of trust in police and an initial fear of retaliation as the reason he was not forthright the night of the incident.

Wit#1 has not been able to sleep and cared deeply for John which prompted him to want to do the right thing by John's family. Wit#1 agreed to come in for a formal statement the following day. Wit#1 also advised his friend Wit#2 was present during the incident and while reluctant was willing to speak with detectives as well. On 08-24-2022 at 1333 hours, Wit#1 responded to police headquarters to provide a formal statement in regard to John's homicide.

Wit#1 was escorted to a 7th floor interview room where he gave the following account: On 08-19-2022, John Greer arrived at Wit#1's home in a blue pick-up truck he (Wit#1) had not seen John driving before. Wit#1 was sitting on his couch when John came in and re-paid him \$20 for gas Wit#1 loaned him the week before. After John paid him, Davon Canady, who Wit#1 referred to as baby Shrek, called out to John from outside of the

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house. Davon said, "John come out the house and handle this business." In response John ran outside to confront Davon.

As John ran outside Wit#1 walked over to the front door and observed Davon attempt to hit John with a black handgun. John blocked the attempted strike and the two began to tussle. Davon passed the handgun back to his cousin Nate (Nathaniel Carter) and a one on one fist fight ensued. John was getting the better of the exchange which caused Davon to cover up and turn his back. Nate then pointed the gun at John and shot him in the back. After witnessing Nate shoot John, Wit#1 ran inside the house to get his shotgun when he heard a second shot. Wit#1 went up the stairs toward the landing when John came stumbling into the house and fell onto a chair in the living room before collapsing onto the floor.

Wit#1 stopped his pursuit for the shotgun and ran down to tend to John. When Wit#1 got downstairs he witnessed Davon, Nate and get into a black Chevrolet Monte Carlo. Another black male with dreadlocks and a black female got into a red car and followed the Monte Carlo northbound on Wayne. The five aforementioned parties had been in the area for several hours prior to the incident. While Wit#1 knows Davon, Nate and since they were young kids from the neighborhood the black male and female in the red vehicle just started coming around a few months prior. Wit#1 did not remember Davon, Nate and names by memory but knew that Davon and father lived off 34th and Flora. A computer check for Davon and DOR address came back to 3419 Flora. Nate is Davon and and were all friends with John growing up. While Wit#1 knows them all by face he learned of their names from people in the neighborhood. On 08-24-2022 at approximately 1330 hours, Wit#2 responded to Police Headquarters, 1125 Locust St., to provide a statement. Wit#2 was escorted to an interview room on the 7th floor where he stated the following: Prior to the shooting, Wit#2 was sitting on the front porch of the house John Greer ran into after he was shot (3534 Wayne Ave). Wit#2 was on the front porch when a group of four people he knows from the neighborhood came to the house to buy food. Wit#2 identified the members of the group as Davon, Nate, , and a female. The group arrived occupying a black 2-door "SS" with a black and white checkerboard pattern on top, driven by Davon.

While the group was outside in the front yard waiting on their food, John arrived, driving an older blue pickup truck that belongs to his (John's) father. As John went inside the residence, Nate said "There goes that bitch ass dude tight there", regarding John. John continued inside the house and stayed there momentarily. When John exited the residence, Davon told him that he was going to "smack" him with his pistol. John proceeded to the yard where Davon was standing. Davon, armed with a black handgun with an extended magazine, attempted to "pistol whip", John. John however, was able to block Davon's attempt to strike him with the gun, and when he did so, Davon handed the gun to Nate who was standing nearby.

John started punching Davon, but the punches did not hurt Davon due to Davon being larger than John. John grabbed Davon from behind and while he was doing so, Nate fired one shot from the gun Devon handed him, striking John. After the shot was fired Wit#2 began to run inside. As Wit#2 went inside he observed Davon take the gun away from Nate, and John was now behind Wit#2 as each of them tried to run inside. Wit#2 observed Devon point the gun at John as he ran up the stairs toward the entrance of the house. Devon fired one shot at John before he made it inside.

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Once inside the residence, Wit#2 saw John collapse onto the floor, choke on his own blood, and take his last breath. Wit#2 stated John was unarmed during the altercation. Wit#2 stated Nate was approximately five feet away from John when he shot him, and clarified that two shots were fired in total, one by Nate and one by Devon. Wit#2 observed Davon, Nate, and the two other people with them leave in the same vehicle they arrived in with Davon driving. Wit#2 stated he did not see another car with them.

Wit#2 stated he met Davon and Nate about two months ago from ordering food at the house, and they told him their names in passing over that time. Wit#2 stated he saw Davon every day at the house for about four or five days prior to the shooting. Wit#2 described Devon as chubby with braids weighing over 200 pounds wearing a black shirt and red shorts. Wit#2 described Nate as having dreadlocks with thick "pop bottle" glasses.

On 08-27-2022 at 0009 hours, PO Darrell James contacted me via email correspondence in regard to a Law Enforcement Resource Center (LERC) vehicle of interest bulletin issued on 08-24-2022 for the black 2-door Chevrolet Monte Carlo (MO Temp tag 063FLE). PO James advised he conducted a car check on the Monte Carlo on 07-26-2022 at 2129 hours and identified the occupants as and Davon Canady. In addition, a video hold of the car stop was requested and saved by PO James. I located the I-Net Viewer event for the car stop which was added to the case file.

On 09-22-2022 at 1058 hours, members of the Career Criminal Unit (CCU) along with Special Investigations Division Tactical Support were conducting surveillance in the area of 7215 Baltimore Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. CCU detectives identified Davon Canady, who has a Person of Interest entry through Mules for homicide, as the driver of a gray Kia Optima. Units conducted a car check on the Kia and took Canady into custody without incident.

Canady was transported to police headquarters and escorted to 7th floor interview room number one. Det. Cook and I made contact with Canady and advised him of his Miranda Rights at which point he declined to give a statement. Canady was then transported, booked and held on a 24-hour investigative hold at East Patrol Detention.

On 09-27-2022 at 1125 hours, members of the Career Criminal Unit (CCU) conducted a residence check at 2715 Indiana Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri for Nathaniel Carter, who had a Person of Interest entry through Mules for homicide. Carter was taken into custody without incident after contact was made.

Carter was transported to police headquarters and escorted to 7th floor interview room number one. I made contact with Carter and advised him of his Miranda Rights at which point he declined to give a statement. Carter was then transported, booked and held on a 24-hour investigative hold at East Patrol Detention.

Based on the foregoing events, I am requesting an arrest warrant for Nathaniel Carter be issued as he poses a danger to the community and the eyewitnesses who are known to him.

Officers rolled the victim over, lifted his shirt and observed a single gunshot wound to the chest. Officers attempted lifesaving measures until EMS responded and transported the victim to TMC where he was later pronounced deceased.

Witnesses at the scene stated they heard two shots coming from the empty lot to the north of 3534 Wayne Avenue. After the shots were fired, several young black males, possibly juveniles, got into a black 2 door Chevrolet Monte Carlo and left the scene in a northbound direction. Officers located a PPU 10mm Auto spent shell casing in the grass of the empty lot. The shell casing was later recovered by responding Crime Scene Investigators who processed the scene.

Detectives from the 1030 Homicide Squad responded to the incident location and obtained Consent to Searches for the residence at 3534 Wayne and the empty lot which were both owned by the homeowner.

Detectives conducted an area canvas for surveillance footage at the time of the homicide and located several cameras on the Kansas City Public Safety Department Headquarters (KCPS), located at 3400 Highland Avenue. Contact was made with a KCPS dispatcher who granted Detectives access to the footage. Around the time of

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the original call for service (08-19-2022 at 2025 hours), the <u>Franklin S parking lot overview 13 camera</u> picks up a dark in color sedan traveling at a high rate of speed northbound on Wayne Avenue through 35th Street. The dark sedan continues northbound past the KCPS Security Department Headquarters building at 2023 hours. A second sedan is seen traveling at a high rate of speed through the same intersection and appeared to be following behind the black sedan.

Detectives then viewed the <u>Franklin Dock Intercom</u> which captures Wayne Avenue further to the north and observe what appeared to be a black 2-door sedan, followed by a 4-door sedan traveling north on Wayne Avenue until out of view. The listed chain of events were also captured on the <u>Franklin Wayne HVAC camera</u> as well. Detectives responded to the area of 33rd Street and Wayne Avenue and observed an exterior camera at 1601 E 33rd Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

Detectives made contact with the resident at 1601 E 33rd Street who granted access to his surveillance footage. On 08-19-2022 at 2024 hours, the WYZE cameras facing northwest toward 33rd Street and Wayne captures what appears to be a black 2-door Chevrolet Monte Carlo (Description consistent with KCPS surveillance footage) arrive at the listed intersection. The Monte Carlo does not stop at the stop sign and turns eastbound onto 33rd Street. Moments later the 4-door sedan, which appears to be a dark gray Nissan, runs the stop sign and continues eastbound behind the Monte Carlo.

After identifying the black 2-door sedan as a Chevrolet Monte Carlo, Detectives began searching Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) along with Genetec cameras in the area of the homicide prior to and after the incident. The Monte Carlo was located on ALPR at 1744 hours on the incident date traveling eastbound on 35th Street and Woodland. However, the reader did not pick up the plate number at that time. A second ALPR hit at the same location (This time traveling westbound) was located on the incident date at 1805 hours. No plate was read on the hit but the photo was clear enough to identify a Missouri temporary tag of 063FLE. A computer check of the tag yielded not on file. Missouri Department of Revenue was contacted in regard to the tag and advised the plate was either altered or was a fake.

On 08-23-2022, Wit#1 reached out to Det. Gantt via phone and stated he needed to talk about the homicide of John Greer. Det. Gantt advised me that Wit#1 wanted to talk further about the incident so Det. Cook and I responded to his residence to speak with him in person. Upon arrival, we made contact with Wit#1 who stated he witnessed the John's murder and wanted to come forward with what he saw that night. Wit#1 cited a lack of trust in police and an initial fear of retaliation as the reason he was not forthright the night of the incident.

Wit#1 has not been able to sleep and cared deeply for John which prompted him to want to do the right thing by John's family. Wit#1 agreed to come in for a formal statement the following day. Wit#1 also advised his friend Wit#2 was present during the incident and while reluctant was willing to speak with detectives as well. On 08-24-2022 at 1333 hours, Wit#1 responded to police headquarters to provide a formal statement in regard to John's homicide.

Wit#1 was escorted to a 7th floor interview room where he gave the following account: On 08-19-2022, John Greer arrived at Wit#1's home in a blue pick-up truck he (Wit#1) had not seen John driving before. Wit#1 was sitting on his couch when John came in and re-paid him \$20 for gas Wit#1 loaned him the week before. After John paid him, Davon Canady, who Wit#1 referred to as baby Shrek, called out to John from outside the house.

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Davon said, "John come out the house and handle this business." In response John ran outside to confront Davon.

As John ran outside Wit#1 walked over to the front door and observed Davon attempt to hit John with a black handgun. John blocked the attempted strike and the two began to tussle. Davon passed the handgun back to his cousin Nate (Nathaniel Carter) and a one on one fist fight ensued. John was getting the better of the exchange which caused Davon to cover up and turn his back. Nate then pointed the gun at John and shot him in the back. After witnessing Nate shoot John, Wit#1 ran inside the house to get his shotgun when he heard a second shot. Wit#1 went up the stairs toward the landing when John came stumbling into the house and fell onto a chair in the living room before collapsing onto the floor.

Wit#1 stopped his pursuit for the shotgun and ran down to tend to John. When Wit#1 got downstairs he witnessed Davon, Nate and get into a black Chevrolet Monte Carlo. Another black male with dreadlocks and a black female got into a red car and followed the Monte Carlo northbound on Wayne. The five aforementioned parties had been in the area for several hours prior to the incident. While Wit#1 knows Davon, Nate and since they were young kids from the neighborhood the black male and female in the red vehicle just started coming around a few months prior. Wit#1 did not remember Davon, Nate and names by memory but knew that Davon and father lived off 34th and Flora. A computer check for Davon and DOR address of DOR address came back to and where all friends with John growing up. While Wit#1 3419 Flora. Nate is Davon and knows them all by face he learned of their names from people in the neighborhood. On 08-24-2022 at approximately 1330 hours, Wit#2 responded to Police Headquarters, 1125 Locust St., to provide a statement. Wit#2 was escorted to an interview room on the 7th floor where he stated the following: Prior to the shooting, Wit#2 was sitting on the front porch of the house John Greer ran into after he was shot (3534 Wayne Ave). Wit#2 was on the front porch when a group of four people he knows from the neighborhood came to the house to buy food. Wit#2 identified the members of the group as Davon, Nate, and a female. The group arrived occupying a black 2-door "SS" with a black and white checkerboard pattern on top, driven by Davon.

While the group was outside in the front yard waiting on their food, John arrived, driving an older blue pickup truck that belongs to his (John's) father. As John went inside the residence, Nate said "There goes that bitch ass dude tight there", regarding John. John continued inside the house and stayed there momentarily. When John exited the residence, Davon told him that he was going to "smack" him with his pistol. John proceeded to the yard where Davon was standing. Davon, armed with a black handgun with an extended magazine, attempted to "pistol whip", John. John however, was able to block Davon's attempt to strike him with the gun, and when he did so, Davon handed the gun to Nate who was standing nearby.

John started punching Davon, but the punches did not hurt Davon due to Davon being larger than John. John grabbed Davon from behind and while he was doing so, Nate fired one shot from the gun Devon handed him, striking John. After the shot was fired Wit#2 began to run inside. As Wit#2 went inside he observed Davon take the gun away from Nate, and John was now behind Wit#2 as each of them tried to run inside. Wit#2 observed Devon point the gun at John as he ran up the stairs toward the entrance of the house. Devon fired one shot at John before he made it inside.

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Once inside the residence, Wit#2 saw John collapse onto the floor, choke on his own blood, and take his last breath. Wit#2 stated John was unarmed during the altercation. Wit#2 stated Nate was approximately five feet away from John when he shot him, and clarified that two shots were fired in total, one by Nate and one by Devon. Wit#2 observed Davon, Nate, and the two other people with them leave in the same vehicle they arrived in with Davon driving. Wit#2 stated he did not see another car with them.

Wit#2 stated he met Davon and Nate about two months ago from ordering food at the house, and they told him their names in passing over that time. Wit#2 stated he saw Davon every day at the house for about four or five days prior to the shooting. Wit#2 described Devon as chubby with braids weighing over 200 pounds wearing a black shirt and red shorts. Wit#2 described Nate as having dreadlocks with thick "pop bottle" glasses.

On 08-27-2022 at 0009 hours, PO Darrell James contacted me via email correspondence in regard to a Law Enforcement Resource Center (LERC) vehicle of interest bulletin issued on 08-24-2022 for the black 2-door Chevrolet Monte Carlo (MO Temp tag 063FLE). PO James advised he conducted a car check on the Monte Carlo on 07-26-2022 at 2129 hours and identified the occupants as and Davon Canady. In addition, a video hold of the car stop was requested and saved by PO James. I located the I-Net Viewer event for the car stop which was added to the case file.

On 09-22-2022 at 1058 hours, members of the Career Criminal Unit (CCU) along with Special Investigations Division Tactical Support were conducting surveillance in the area of 7215 Baltimore Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. CCU detectives identified Davon Canady, who has a Person of Interest entry through Mules for homicide, as the driver of a gray Kia Optima. Units conducted a car check on the Kia and took Canady into custody without incident.

Canady was transported to police headquarters and escorted to 7th floor interview room number one. Det. Cook and I made contact with Canady and advised him of his Miranda Rights at which point he declined to give a statement. Canady was then transported, booked and held on a 24-hour investigative hold at East Patrol Detention.
