Count I. Assault 1st Degree Or Attempt - Serious Physical Injury Or Special Victim (565.050-001Y20201307.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.050, RSMo, committed the class A felony assault in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about on or about November 19, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another, shot at the victim, and such conduct was a substantial step toward the commission of the offense of assault in the first degree of Trooper , a law enforcement officer, and was done for the purpose of committing such assault, and in the course thereof was a special victim as defined by Section 565.002.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about November 19, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another, committed the felony of Assault in the First Degree charged in Count I, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Assault in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.3, RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years.

Count III. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/From Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building (571.030-020Y20205213.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.030, RSMo, committed the class B Felony of unlawful use of a weapon, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 571.030.9, RSMo, in that on or about November 19, 2022, at Shaw Parkway and NW 6th Street, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another, knowingly discharged a firearm from a gray 2021 Ram Rebel, motor vehicle.

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years.

Count IV. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about November 19, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another, committed the felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon charged in Count III, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.3, RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years.

Count V. Tampering With Motor Vehicle - 1st Degree (569.080-002Y20202999.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 569.080.1(2), RSMo, committed the class D felony of tampering in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 558.002, RSMo, in that on or about November 19, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly and without the consent of the owner unlawfully operated a gray 2021 Ram Rebel, an automobile.

The range punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count VI. Resisting Arrest/Detention/Stop By Fleeing - Creating A Substantial Risk Of Serious Injury/Death To Any Person (575.150-002Y20204801.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 575.150, RSMo, committed the class E felony of resisting a lawful stop, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about on or about November 19, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, a law enforcement officer was attempting to make a lawful stop of a vehicle being operated by defendant, and the defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another, knew or reasonably should have known that the officer was making a lawful stop, and, for the purpose of preventing the officer from effecting the stop, resisted the stop of defendant by fleeing from the officer and defendant, either acting alone or in concert with another, fled in such a manner that created a substantial risk of serious physical injury or death to other persons in that defendant operated a motor vehicle at high rates of speed, weaved in and out of traffic and fired shots at the officer.

The range punishment for a class E felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed four (4) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count VII. Tampering With Physical Evidence In Felony Prosecution (575.100-001Y20205006.0)

- 1. I have probable cause to believe that John Preston Glock, Jr., on 11/19/2022, at Shaw Parkway west of NW 6th Street, Blue Springs, Jackson County, Missouri, committed the offense(s) listed below: (To be determined by Prosecuting Attorney)
- 2. State the facts that support a finding of probable cause to believe crime(s) was/were committed and that the accused committed the crime(s):

 On Friday, November 19, 2022, at approximately 1803 hours, Trooper attempted to conduct a traffic stop of a gray Ram pickup truck, bearing a Kansas temporary registration, for traveling 92 miles per hour in an area limited to 70 miles per hour. Trooper attempted to initiate the traffic stop on westbound Interstate 70 at Grain Valley, in Jackson County, Missouri. The driver of the vehicle briefly pulled over and as exited his patrol car, the truck accelerated away at a high rate of speed and a pursuit ensued. As Trooper pursued the vehicle on Shaw Parkway, west of NW 6th Street, in Blue Springs, Missouri, a rear seat passenger of the vehicle emerged from the right rear window and fired several shots at Trooper striking his patrol vehicle. Trooper subsequently lost sight of the vehicle as it fled. Processing of the scene resulted in the recovery of three 9mm shell casings near the intersection of NW 6th Street Terrace and Shaw Parkway.

An area canvas revealed the vehicle was abandoned in the LaQuinta Inn parking lot in Blue Springs, Missouri. A computer check of the vehicle indicated it was reported as stolen through the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department. A 9mm shell casing was located in the bed of the truck.

An area canvas revealed video footage from the neighboring Motel 6 directly east of the LaQuinta Inn. This video shows three suspects (two white males and one white female) leaving the vehicle. This footage showed the three suspects park the vehicle on the East side of the LaQuinta Inn, before running east to the adjoining Motel 6. The suspects entered the guest laundry area briefly, before the driver of the vehicle entered the front office and rented a room (Room 214), providing an ID indentifying him as John GLOCK. GLOCK was ultimately identified as John P. GLOCK, date of birth May 14, 1993. During this transaction, GLOCK appeared to place an unknown object near the vending machine, before retrieving the item, and instead placing it in a trash can in the lobby. This trash can was later searched and the item was found to have been the key fob belonging to the RAM pickup. While GLOCK was renting the room, he had removed his sweatshirt and placed it on a table in the lobby. GLOCK picked up the sweatshirt when he left; however, as he was observed walking to the room, he was no longer in possession of the sweatshirt. This sweatshirt was found behind an electrical box near the guest laundry area near the northwest corner of the building.

GLOCK and the other two suspects only stayed in the rented room (Room 214) for a matter of minutes before leaving. They exited the room, which was on the second level, and walked south to a stairwell at the southeast corner of the building. It is unknown where they went, as the surveillance cameras did not capture their direction of travel after reaching the stairwell.

Processing of the scene resulted in the recovery of three 9mm shell casings near the intersection of NW 6th Street Terrace and Shaw Parkway.

An area canvas revealed the vehicle was abandoned in the LaQuinta Inn parking lot in Blue Springs, Missouri. A computer check of the vehicle indicated it was reported as stolen through the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department. (On November 21, 2022, the complainant who reported the vehicle stolen was contacted by Missouri State Highway Patrol Corporal Brandon Parker. The vehicle was determined to have been stolen from a transport lot owned by ADESA Kansas City, a vehicle auction business. At least one other vehicle, as well as multiple vehicle keys, were also stolen during the same incident.)

An area canvas revealed video footage from the neighboring Motel 6 directly east of the LaQuinta Inn. This video shows three suspects (two white males and one white female) leaving the vehicle. This footage showed the three suspects park the vehicle on the East side of the LaQuinta Inn, before running east to the adjoining Motel 6. The suspects entered the guest laundry area briefly, before the driver of the vehicle entered the front office and rented a room (Room 214), providing an ID indentifying him as John GLOCK. GLOCK was ultimately identified as John P. GLOCK. During this transaction, GLOCK appeared to place an unknown object near the vending machine, before retrieving the item, and instead placing it in a trash can in the lobby. This trash can was later searched and the item was found to have been the key fob belonging to the RAM pickup.

GLOCK and the other two suspects only stayed in the rented room (Room 214) for a matter of minutes before leaving. The other male subject was wearing a black shirt, black pants, and a black knit hat. They exited the room, which was on the second level, and walked south to a stairwell at the southeast corner of the building. As the male subject wearing all black exited the room, he can be seen carrying a white towel. As he approached the stairwell area, he appears to be reaching into his front right pocket or waistband area. It is unknown where

the subjects went from there, as the surveillance cameras did not capture their direction of travel after reaching the stairwell.

An area canvas also revealed video footage from the LaQuinta Inn. This video corroborates the actions seen in the Motel 6 video, and shows the three suspects park the Ram on the southeast corner of the LaQuinta Inn building and flee from the vehicle. GLOCK is seen exiting the driver's door, the female is seen exiting the front passenger door, and male subject wearing a black shirt, black pants, and a black knit hat exits the rear passenger door.

During the course of the investigation, information was obtained from the Missouri State Highway Patrol Gaming Division that GLOCK was identified at Bally's Casino on the morning of November 18, 2022. Also identified with GLOCK was a linear lateral in a relationship and have a child in common. Was ultimately positively identified by surveillance footage as being the female suspect.
On November 21, 2022, was taken into custody on unrelated charges. During a subsequent interview, she stated information related to the identity of the suspect who fired at law enforcement was contained in her cellular device. She identified the subject only as "Chris." A consensual search of her cellular device identified the subject as Christopher NORTHCUTT. NORTHCUTT was ultimately identified as Christopher A. NORTHCUTT, date of birth August 15, 1991. NORTHCUTT has a criminal history under SID MO79970191. NORTHCUTT has multiple active warrants for his arrest from Jackson County, Missouri, Johnson County, Missouri, the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department, and the Independence, Missouri Police Department. Northcutt was positively identified on surveillance video as being the third suspect who was wearing the black shirt, black pants, and a black knit hat.
On November 20, 2022, the Motel 6 property, and Room 214, were searched. A black knit hat was located on the floor in Room 214. A Ruger 9mm firearm was recovered from the southeast stairwell (same stairwell used by suspects to leave). The Ruger was concealed underneath the stairs, under a white towel, and under dirt, leaves, and other debris. (NORTHCUTT can be seen on video surveillance leaving Room 214 and walking towards this stairwell, with a white towel in his hands.)
NORTHCUTT currently has active warrants for failure to appear, tampering, and resisting law enforcement. As such, NORTHCUTT has shown criminal summons to be insufficient, and has posed a significant threat to law enforcement and the public in general. I request an arrest warrant be issued for NORTHCUTT for his involvement in these crimes.
