COMPLAINT WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Murder 2nd Degree - Felony Murder - During Perpetration/Attempted Perpetration/Flight From Perpetration Of A Felony, A Person Dies (565.021-003Y20200999.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the class A felony of murder in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, Cardell Crawford was killed by being shot as a result of the perpetration of the class B felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon under Section 571.030, RSMo, committed by the defendant on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Murder in the Second Degree as charged in Count 1, all allegations of which are incorporated here by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Murder in the Second Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.3, RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years.

Count III. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/From Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building (571.030-020Y20205299.)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of in violation of Section 571.030, RSMo, committed the class B Felony of unlawful use of a weapon, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 571.030.9, RSMo, in that on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly shot a firearm at another person, Cardell Crawford.

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years. For the first violation of this crime, a person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony.

Count IV. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon as charged in Count 3, all allegations of which are incorporated here by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Crimi-

nal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.3, RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years.

Count V. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/From Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building (571.030-020Y20205299.)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of in violation of Section 571.030, RSMo, committed the class B Felony of unlawful use of a weapon, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 571.030.9, RSMo, in that on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly shot a firearm at another person,

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years. For the first violation of this crime, a person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony.

Count VI. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon as charged in Count 5, all allegations of which are incorporated here by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. Count VII. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 9 - Shoot At/From Motor Vehicle, At Person, Motor Vehicle Or Building (571.030-020Y20205299.)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of in violation of Section 571.030, RSMo, committed the class B Felony of unlawful use of a weapon, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 571.030.9, RSMo, in that on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly shot a firearm at another person,

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years. For the first violation of this crime, a person shall be sentenced to the maximum authorized term of imprisonment for a class B felony.

Count VIII. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon as charged in Count 7, all allegations of which are incorporated here by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Unlawful Use of a Weapon by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.052, RSMo, committed the class D felony of assault in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about

July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant recklessly caused physical injury to by means of discharge of a firearm.

The range punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count X. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1 RSMo, in that on or about on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Assault in the Second Degree as charged in Count 9, all allegations of which are incorporated here by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Assault in the Second Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.052, RSMo, committed the class D felony of assault in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant recklessly caused physical injury to by means of discharge of a firearm.

The range punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed seven (7) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

Count XII. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1 RSMo, in that on or about on or about July 10, 2022, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Assault in the Second Degree as charged in Count 11, all allegations of which are incorporated here by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Assault in the Second Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case

the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

The facts supporting this belief are as fol	llows:				

On 07/10/2022 at approximately 2303 hours, Officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department working off-duty law enforcement capacity at the Westport Ale House located at 4128 Broadway Boulevard, Kansas City, Jackson County Missouri were attempting to disperse a large crowd of individuals who were involved in a physical altercation inside/outside the establishment.

During the altercation several individuals began shooting at each other outside the establishment, to the south. Officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department also fired several rounds at individuals who were shooting. Multiple individuals were struck by gunfire, including one who later died from his injuries.

Members of the Missouri Highway Patrol and Detectives from the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were called to investigate.

During the course of the investigation, Detectives recovered surveillance video from the area.

On 07/10/2022 at 20:05:58 DVR Time, a camera from the outside front entrance to the Westport Ale House depicted the following:

Four males approach and enter the Ale House. The first male is later identified as Lavont Carter and is seen wearing an orange hat, black t-shirt with white/red on the front, dark green shorts, and black/white shoes. The same male is seen handing his identification card to a security officer. The security officer can be seen scanning the ID at 20:06:02 DVR Time. A search of the records from the ID scanner showed the individual to be Layont Carter, black male, 05/06/2001.

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In addition, witness, who is familiar with Carter from past encounters, viewed the surveillance video and identified the individual wearing the orange hat, who just had his ID scanned (Carter's ID) on surveillance video as Layont Carter.

At 23:01:01 DVR Time, a large disturbance involving security officers, Police Officers and multiple other individuals is observed in the stairwell of the Westport Ale House. Lavont Carter can be seen in the middle of the disturbance and appears to be grabbing and pushing people in the disturbance. A Police Officer appears to grab Carter, pull him away from the disturbance and push him out of the door to the Ale House. Carter appears to be resisting the Officer and the Officer has to pick him up to get him out of the establishment.

07/10/2022 at 23:02:27 DVR Time, inside front door of the Westport Ale House: Lavont Carter can be seen, through the Ale House window, walking southbound on Broadway on the sidewalk with another male believed to be his brother Devon Carter.

07/10/2022 at 23:02:51 DVR Time, inside front door of the Westport Ale House: The deceased victim (CC) is seen leaving the Ale House onto Broadway.

07/10/2022 at 23:03:13 DVR Time, inside front door to the Westport Ale House: One of the living shooting victims is seen leaving the Ale House.

07/10/2022 at 23:03:45 DVR Time, inside front door to the Westport Ale House: and CC are seen walking southbound on the sidewalk on Broadway through the Ale House window.

07/10/2022 at 23:03:01 DVR Time, SE Parking (Cameras from 4141 Pennsylvania): Lavont and Devon are seen walking up to a gray Hyundai Sonata.

07/10/2022 at 23:03:12 DVR Time, SE Parking (Cameras from 4141 Pennsylvania): Lavont is seen walking back northbound after appearing to get into the Hyundai Sonata, Devon can be seen walking back northbound behind Lavont.

07/10/2022 at 23:03:29 DVR Time, SE Parking (Cameras from 4141 Pennsylvania): Devon appears to start jogging northbound past Lavont.

07/10/2022 at 23:03:36 DVR time, NE Parking (Cameras from 4141 Pennsylvania): Lavont appears to hand something to a person wearing a white t-shirt and jeans. The male appears to tuck the item into his waistband and continue walking northbound behind Lavont.

07/10/2022 at 23:03:49 DVR Time, (Cameras from 4141 Pennsylvania): CC appears to run southbound on the west sidewalk of Broadway.

07/10/2022 at 23:03:51 DVR Time, SE Parking (Cameras from 4141 Pennsylvania): The lights to the van can be seen flashing as if someone unlocked it. CC can be seen running over to the driver side of the van. appears to get into the front passenger seat.

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07/10/2022 at 23:03:57 DVR Time, NE Parking (Cameras from 4141 Pennsylvania): Lavont appears to stop and then turnaround to go southbound after CC and Lavont can be seen raising his arm in a shooting stance/position. 07/10/2022 at 23:04:03 DVR Time, SE Parking (Cameras from 4141 Pennsylvania): Lavont appears to run up to the front passenger side of the van. The image is blurry however it appears his arm is still extended in a shooting position. Layont then turns and runs southbound along Broadway near or on the sidewalk. 07/10/2022 at 23:04:06 DVR Time, (Camera from the Broadway Blvd.): The front passenger side door of the Hyundai Sonata opens and then closes. A male appearing to be Lavont Carter runs past the front passenger side door of the Hyundai southbound and appears to fall to the ground. He stands back up and appears to be pointing an object consistent with a handgun northbound while running back northbound.
