The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 04/04/2023 at approximately 0055 hours, Officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to 6403 Manchester Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri on a reported shooting.

Upon Officers arrival, they were contacted by a witness [REDACTED] who indicated where the victim was at and stated "Uncle Keith" is in the hallway dead. Officers located the victim in the 2nd floor hallway of 6413 Manchester Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. KCFD EMS personnel arrived and pronounced the victim deceased on scene. Officers noticed the door to 6413 Manchester Avenue apartment 19 was ajar and cleared it to determine if there were more victims inside.

Officers re-contacted [REDACTED] who advised she was visiting [REDACTED] at 6413 Manchester Avenue apartment #2 when [REDACTED] the known [REDACTED] of the victim arrived stating the victim had just thrown her out of the apartment. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] called her daughter to come pick her up and as [REDACTED] was walking back towards 6413 Manchester Avenue, she heard a gunshot, and observed [REDACTED] walking out of the apartment building.

A search warrant was executed on 6413 Manchester Apt. 19, the victim's apartment, and one spent 9mm shell casing was recovered.

Through the course of the investigation, Detectives obtained surveillance footage of the Park Highlands Apartments complex. The footage revealed the following: on 04/04/2023, at approximately 0008 hours, a woman, later learned to be [REDACTED] was observed walking westbound from the victim's apartment building to another building located a short distance away. At 0022 hours, the victim is captured on the 2nd floor exterior staircase of his apartment building. The victim then walks back inside. At approximately 0027 hours, what was later learned to be a 2010 Nissan Altima bearing a MO temporary tag of 06KTAL, entered the complex parking lot. [REDACTED] later identified herself as the driver of the vehicle and subsequently identified David Randall as

the front passenger and Darren Randall as the rear passenger. ■ stopped the vehicle, turned the headlamps off as David Randall, wearing a white t-shirt, denim shorts, a white ball cap and white tennis shoes, and Darren Randall dressed in a light-colored hoodie, dark pants and red tennis shoes exited the vehicle. ■ is then captured driving a short distance where she backed into a parking space, across from the victim's apartment building, to pick up her ■. While this is occurring, David and Darren are captured walking toward the backside of the victim's apartment building. After ■ gets into the vehicle with ■ the two drive away and toward the exit of the apartment complex, however, ■ turns the headlamps of the vehicle off and appears to be waiting. On a different camera angle, simultaneously as the movements of the vehicle are captured, David and Darren (identified by their clothing) are captured exiting the third-floor apartment door where they walk down the exterior stairs and then re-enter the building on the 2nd floor, at approximately 0033 minutes. This is the same floor in which the victim resides. As the previously described actions of David and Darren are occurring, the vehicle driven by ■ exits the complex parking lot where it travels a short distance on the roadway and out of camera view. Moments later the vehicle is captured coming back toward the complex property, but the vehicle remains on the roadway, with the headlamps off. Approximately 2 minutes later at 0035 hours, while the parking lot, sidewalks and stairs are free of any other pedestrian or vehicle traffic, the same two individuals, identified by their clothing, run from behind the victim's apartment, through the courtyard and continue running until they re-enter the backseat of ■ vehicle which is parked with headlamps off. The vehicle then flees the complex still with headlamps off.

Through the police computer database, the Nissan showed to be registered to ■. A felony stop order was placed into the computer system for the vehicle related to the homicide.

On 04/05/2023, KCPD Officers conducted a car check of the suspect vehicle in regard to the incident. During the car check, two occupants were identified as ■ and David Randall. At the time of the car check, Randall was in possession of a controlled substance for which he was arrested and placed on an investigative hold.

In two separate interviews, ■ provided the following statements: On 04-03-2023, ■ advised she had been at a birthday party with David Randall (spouse) and two of David's brothers; one of which she identified as Darren Randall. ■ said after the birthday party, the four of them went to a local casino. It was while they were at the casino, she began receiving phone calls to pick up ■, who had been kicked out of the victim's home. ■ she was driving her vehicle, while David Randall occupied the front passenger seat and Darren Randall occupied the rear seat. She advised she let the two of them out of her vehicle in the parking lot of the victim's apartment complex to urinate. Although she said when David got out of the vehicle, David said, "Come with me, bro." She then proceeded, without them, through the parking lot to pick up ■, who was waiting outside. ■ then waited for David and Darren Randall to return to the vehicle at a separate location in the parking lot of the apartment complex. ■ said David and Darren ran back to her vehicle and after dropping Darren off at his home, she and David went to David's ■, ■. ■ admitted she has been frustrated with how the victim treats her mother. She explained the victim takes her mother's money; causing more of a financial burden for ■ who resides with her mother. ■ also said the victim had gotten her mother addicted to crack. ■ acknowledged she had expressed these frustrations to David Randall and he too, did not like the victim. ■ said David is known to carry a firearm in his pocket nearly all the time. ■ said Darren Randall had never been to the victim's residence before nor had he ever met the victim. ■ also said she had never seen Darren possess a firearm. A text message was seen on ■ phone that she said she had sent to ■ stating, "I'll

shoot that n*gga in his other eye." [REDACTED] advised she was referring to the victim in the message and said it out of anger. When asked if she could provide the time of the text message, [REDACTED] said she had just deleted the message (during the interview) because she conveyed it did not look favorable for her to have sent that message. [REDACTED] said she knew something had happened based off David and Darren's behavior, but she is fearful of David and did not want to ask him any questions. [REDACTED] initially denied knowing the victim had died, but when confronted with a Google search of the homicide just over an hour after Officers were dispatched to the crime [REDACTED] admitted David had confessed he had knocked on the victim's door and when the victim answered, the victim said, "Deborah is tripping." [REDACTED] also said David Randall told her "It was done." And she said David said, "I'm sorry. It wasn't supposed to be like that."

On 04-05-2023, [REDACTED] was interviewed and advised she had [REDACTED] to come pick her up from the victim's apartment complex. [REDACTED] said she text [REDACTED] to come pick her up and text the word "help." [REDACTED] said she did not mean to convey she was in distress, but rather wanted to get her daughter's attention that she was wanted to be picked up. [REDACTED] said after she was picked up, her daughter parked the car and was waiting in the parking lot [REDACTED] said she saw who she knew to be her daughter's husband, [REDACTED] and his younger brother who wore glasses, running and getting into the vehicle. [REDACTED] said she asked them why they were running and she was told not to worry about it.

On 04-06-2023, David Randall was interviewed about the homicide investigation while in custody for drug possession. During the interview, D. Randall denied any involvement in the homicide and denied he was at the victim's apartment complex on the night of the homicide. D. Randall did say he had been at a casino with two of his brothers and his wife on 04-03-2023 after attending a birthday party. D. Randall denied being the person captured in the surveillance video, despite being identified by [REDACTED]. D. Randall said he had not been to the victim's apartment since February. D. Randall was later captured on a recorded jail conversation telling [REDACTED] it's "his word" against her mother's and her mother is a "crack head." D. Randall told [REDACTED] to stop talking to police. D. Randall went on to say, Detectives would not see his cell phone information at the crime scene because the phone had a dead battery. D. Randall also told [REDACTED] recorded jail conversations she should have never given the name of his brother and she should call Detectives to "make this right" because "we were never there."

Surveillance video was recovered from the casino, in which David Randall, Darren Randall, [REDACTED] and an unknown male are captured entering the casino at 2237 hours and exiting the casino at 2353 hours. The clothing David Randall and Darren Randall are captured wearing on the casino camera footage is the similar to the clothing surveillance footage captured them wearing at the homicide scene.

On 04-07-2023, a review of the Secures Technologies Jackson County recorded jail conversations, David Randall contacted his mother. D. Randall instructs his mother of the following: "That thing you got. I need that mother fucker up the river, somewhere. Gotta get rid of it. You hear me?" He then repeats himself and says, "Send it up the river somewhere. You gotta get rid of that." His mother, says, "you need to get rid of the mother fucking people that's talking."

A search warrant was executed on 8417 Greenwood, the residence of David Randall's [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] provided a statement in regard to the above captioned recorded conversation. As the interview progressed, [REDACTED] eventually advised that after dropping off medication for David Randall while in custody at Metro Patrol

Division station, she and her daughter drove back to her daughter's residence where [REDACTED] was provided a black firearm wrapped in a white t-shirt. [REDACTED] said she then disposed of the firearm in her home trash, then took her home trash to a nearby apartment complex dumpster. [REDACTED] accompanied Detectives and gave directions on where she had disposed of the firearm, however, the firearm was not recovered.

On 04-08-2022, upon listening to further Secures Technologies Jackson County recorded jail conversations, David Randall was advised by [REDACTED], that a search warrant had been served and Detectives were looking for DNA. David Randall asked his mother if Detectives had found his "shoes in the shoe box." Detectives responded to 8417 Greenwood and re-contacted [REDACTED] after hearing this conversation. [REDACTED] said she had never received a box of shoes from David Randall's sister, [REDACTED]

On 04-08-2023, a subsequent search warrant was executed at the home of David Randall's sister, DR. DR provided a statement and initially stated that she was not certain as to what her mother had told Detectives the day prior, but she provided her mother with glass vials of PCP, not a firearm. Eventually, as the interview continued, DR said she was directed by David Randall, while he was in custody at the Metro Patrol Division station, to a shoe box in her bedroom closet. DR said inside the shoe box was a black firearm, wrapped in a white t-shirt. DR said she has been to the gun range before and believed the firearm was a 9mm. DR also said she did provide her mother with glass vials of PCP. DR said she did not give her mother the firearm in a shoebox. The firearm was wrapped in a white T-shirt.
