MISDEMEANOR INFORMATION WARRANT REQUESTED

In the Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, at, Term, 2023. In Division Number 29 thereof, designated by the rules of said Court as Criminal Division A.

Count I. Animal Abuse (578.012-001Y202055990)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 578.012, RSMo, committed the class A misdemeanor of animal abuse, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 558.002, RSMo, in that on or about February 16, 2023, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant had custody of a female white and gray dog and knowingly failed to provide adequate shelter and care to the dog, which resulted in substantial harm to the dog.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts, filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

Data: 04/20/2022

On 02/16/2023 at approximately 1258 hours, Animal Services Officers (ASO) with the Kansas City Pet Project (KCPP) Animal Services Division responded to 4110 Wayne Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri on reports of a dog being abandoned at the home. The outside temperature at the time of the ASO's arrival was 25 degrees Fahrenheit with a 9-14 MPD wind and light snow falling.

Upon arriving at 4110 Wayne Avenue, ASO's knocked on the door and received no answer, nor did they hear a dog bark or move when they knocked. Upon first look, it did not appear that there was a dog at the home.

The property at 4112 Wayne Avenue was an empty lot. At that time, ASO's walked the fence line, staying within the 4112 Wayne property. They did not see a dog in the backyard and they could not hear a dog at 4110 Wayne Avenue. ASO's called the reporting party but got no answer and there was no option to leave a voicemail.

While ASO's were still on scene, a white sedan with Arizona license plates pulled into the driveway of 4110 Wayne Avenue. There were two women in the vehicle, one in her late 30's and the other that appeared to be an older female. The younger of the two got out of the vehicle and identified herself as "Alisha" and told the ASO the dog was in the garage at the back of the house. "Alisha" led ASO's back to the garage where the garage door was fully open. "Alisha" pointed to a white dog kennel and told ASO's she believed the dog had eaten its own feces and now had Parvo Virus.

As ASO's entered the garage, they immediately smelled the overwhelming smell of dog urine and feces. ASO's saw a medium sized gray and white dog that was lying in an icy mixture of feces and urine that appeared to be approximately ½ inch deep. The dog was lying on its stomach, not moving, and appeared to be deceased. While standing there, the ASO's observed the dog take one breath. At that time, they immediately took possession of the dog and transported it to Kansas City Pet Project for emergency treatment.

While placing the wire kennel into the transport truck, "Alisha" noticed a half chewed plastic boxing glove on top of the kennel and asked for the glove back before the dog was transported.

After the dog was transported, one ASO remained on scene to obtain a statement from "Alisha". When asked what her last name was, she hesitated, then responded "Cox". When asked for her date of birth, "Alisha" hesitated again and then stated "5, no wait, 8-5-84". "Alisha" then stated she was on house arrest and staying at her mother's home in Raytown.

ASO asked "Alisha" about the dog and she stated it belonged to her child's father. When asked for his name and date of birth, she stated his name was Quentin Curtis and his birthday was August or September 25, 1995. "Alisha" stated Quentin didn't have permission to leave the dog at the home but he brought it over approximately one month prior. "Alisha" stated Quentin would check on the dog every 2-3 days.

"Alisha" stated her house arrest specifies she can only come to the house once a week on Thursdays to check the house and mail. "Alisha" stated last week (02/09/23) the dog had food and water and looked "fine". "Alisha" stated she rents the home at 4110 Wayne Avenue with her sister but both she and her sister are staying at their mom's house.

The older woman in the car stayed in the car the entire time the ASO spoke with "Alisha" and at one point "Alisha" identified her as her mother. At one point, the woman called out to "Alisha" but the end of the name ended with an I-C-A and not an I-S-H-A sound. The contact ended with the parties and the ASO responded to the KCPP emergency clinic.

The following is a summer of the dog's medical abnormalities as documented by clinic staff during treatment on 02/16/2023:

- The dog was complete covered in bloody liquid stools
- Approximately 1" pool of standing liquid stools in tray crate
- The dog's liquid stools were extremely cold to the touch
- Dehydration levels were approximately 12%
- Bleeding sores on paw pads of all four feet
- Rectal temperature too low to read on thermometers which go down to 90 degrees Fahrenheit
- · Flushed copious amounts of stool from mouth
- · Canine parvo test results were "negative"
- Canine stool grade was rated 7/7
- Heart rate recordings taken during lifesaving care:
- o 1st reading taken at 1415 hours: 48 BPM
- o 2nd reading taken at 1500 hours: 60 BPM
- o 3rd reading taken at 1548 hours: 72 BPM

In addition to the aforementioned facts, this dog was also found within a wire kennel in the following condition:

- · The dog was in a non-conscious state
- The dog was in a non-ambulatory state

- The dog was non-responsive to verbal and audio stimulation
- The dog's respiration rate was slow and breath sounds were labored
- The dog was covered on all sides with brown semi-frozen fecal debris
- · The dog had urine scalding on all four feet
- · The dog was accompanied by a putrid smell of urine and fecal matter
- The dog's plastic floor tray was complete full of urine and fecal debris
- The dog had a body condition score factor of 2/9 meaning sever emaciation was present
- The dog was in a semi-frozen state including icy chunks of feces adhered to the dog
- The dog had no water or access to potable water present
- The dog had no food stuffs wholesome and palatable within reach or nearby
- · The dogs wire crate did not provide sufficient protection from the weather

In the following days, more medical testing was completed, including additional Parvo tests. Parvo test came back with negative results. It was also the opinion of KCPP veterinary staff the neglect had gone on for some time to cause the levels of emaciation and dehydration present.

Further investigation took place in order to identify both "Alisha" and Quentin Curtis. A check through Kansas City Missouri Police Departments report writing system showed history at 4110 Wayne Avenue for Onica Monet Morgan, black female, 05/08/1984, and Johnny Curtis, black male, 09/20/1995. A check through MULES 5 showed a full response for Johnny Q. Curtis Jr., black male, 09/20/1995. It should be noted that while "Alisha" was showing the ASO text messages between her and "Quentin", the ASO observed the name on the contact in the text messages to be Johnny. The number used to notify KCPP on 02/16/2023 was 913-212-4010. A check through KCPD's report writing system showed that number to respond to Onica Monet Morgan.

Cruelty Investigation Manager at KCPP, Richard Rohrback, conducted a search through their system for every time they'd received a call from Onica's phone number. Rohrback located a call from approximately one week prior where Onica left a message asking the Pet Support Center for information on pet vaccines.

On 03/24/2023, Detective Plaschka with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department contacted Onica's mother, Sharon Morgan, regarding this investigation. Sharon stated Onica has been staying with her in Raytown for at least a year even though she rents the house at 4110 Wayne Avenue. Sharon stated Johnny Curtis is Onica's exboyfriend and they have two children together. Johnny's mom had the gray and white dog but she got kicked out of her apartment and couldn't keep the dog. Johnny asked Onica if he could keep the dog at Onica's house. Sharon believed the dog had been at Onica's for a couple of months. Sharon stated Johnny became upset when he found out the dog was gone and he's afraid to get the dog from KCPP. Sharon confirmed Onica's phone number is 913-212-4010 and confirmed that Onica is currently residing at 4110 Wayne Avenue.

On 03/24/2023, Detective Plaschka with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department contacted the number provided for Onica. The female that answered the phone first said it was Onica, then upon finding out what the call was about, promptly stated it wasn't Onica. She stated Onica didn't have anything to do with the dog and that Onica didn't even live at 4110 Wayne Avenue.

Onica is currently on pre-trial supervision through Northland Dependency and her supervision officer is Aishia Oglesvie. Oglesvie was contacted and stated Onica was never told she could only go to her home at 4110 Wayne Avenue on Thursdays and that was never a condition of her release.

Northland Dependency provided a proximity report from Onica's ankle monitor, which shows the dates and times Onica was at 4110 Wayne Avenue. Between 01/26/2023 and 02/16/2023, Onica hit within 1000 feet of 4110 Wayne Avenue 22 times. Fourteen of those hits were on days other than Thursday.

In preparation of Onica possibly coming to reclaim the dog, an Unfit Owner Declaration was prepared.

As of 03/03/2023, neither Onica Morgan, nor Johnny Curtis Jr. had made any attempt to reclaim the victim in this case. The dog's ownership legally transferred to KC Pet Project on 02/21/2023.
