# COMPLAINT WARRANT REQUESTED

## Count I. Assault 1st Degree Or Attempt - Serious Physical Injury Or Special Victim (565.050-001Y20201305.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.050, RSMo, committed the class A felony assault in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about on or about November 12, 2023, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly caused serious physical injury to CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM by shooting and cutting CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM, and in the course thereof defendant inflicted serious physical injury on CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

#### **Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.0)**

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about November 12, 2023, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Assault in the First Degree charged in Count 1, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Assault in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.3, RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years.

### Count III. Kidnapping - Facilitating A Felony - Inflicting Injury - Terrorizing - 1st Degree (565.110-002Y20201005.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.110, RSMo, committed the class B felony of kidnapping in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about November 12, 2023, defendant unlawfully confined CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM for a substantial period, without CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM'S consent by the threat of force, for the purpose of inflicting physical injury on or terrorizing CONFIDENTIAL VICTIM.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

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Detectives of the Grandview Police Department described the victim as having trauma to her body to include what appeared to be stab wounds, a gunshot wound, bruises, cuts, abrasions and broken teeth, however, a preliminary autopsy report was not available at this time.	7
On 11/13/2023, Grandview Detectives obtained a search warrant for  At approximately 1905 hours, members of the Kansas City Missouri Police Department Tactical Unit served the search warrant on the residence. No one was located inside the residence. While Tactical Officers were clearing the residence, they observed what appeared to be blood in several locations of the residence, a knife on the couch and a spen shell casing in the bedroom.	
Due to the aforementioned information recived from Tactical Officers, members of the Kansas City Missouri Homicide Unit along with members of the Kansas City Police Crime Scene Section responded to process the scene at with Detectives of the Grandview Police Department. Utilizing luminol, a large presence of blood was indicated throughout the residence to include areas on the wall, kitchen floor, a laundry room and hallway. A spent .45 caliber shell casing as well as what appeared to be a human tooth was located in the laundry room. Paperwork and mail in the name of "Tyheem Anderson" with a date of birth of was also located inside th residence.
