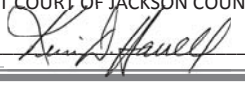

COMPLAINT
WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Voluntary Manslaughter (565.023-001Y20200999.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.023, RSMo, committed the class B felony of voluntary manslaughter, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about January 3, 2024, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly or with the purpose of causing serious physical injury to Confidential Victim, caused the death of Confidential Victim by stabbing him.

The class B felony carries a punishment range of from 5 years to 15 years in the Missouri Department of Corrections.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section (571.015.1) (571.015.2) (571.015.3), RSMo, in that on or about on or about January 3, 2024, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant is guilty of the felony of voluntary manslaughter charged in Count I, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of voluntary manslaughter by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a dangerous instrument.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.3, RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 01-03-2024 at approximately 2159 hours, officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED] Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in regard to an EMS call. Upon their arrival they located the victim lying in the front yard of [REDACTED] Officers and EMS personnel determined that the victim had sustained an edged weapon injury to his chest. The victim was pronounced deceased as a result of his injury. [REDACTED]

A body exam was conducted on the victim at the Jackson County Medical Examiner's Office. The exam indicated that the victim sustained a sharp edged weapon injury to his chest, as well as multiple sharp edged weapon injuries to his scalp and jaw. Due the victim's jeans being unzipped and damp in the crotch area and apparent ejaculate on the tip of his penis, DNA swabs were taken.

The Jackson County Medical Examiner's Office ruled the victim's death a homicide.

The KCPD Homicide Unit, 990 Squad was summoned to investigate the murder of the victim. It was determined at the crime scene that the victim was likely attacked while sitting inside his [REDACTED] parked in front of [REDACTED] A blood trail from the location of the victim's body led to the [REDACTED] Detectives observed apparent blood inside of the vehicle. Detectives towed the victim's [REDACTED] and collected DNA Swabs and Fingerprint cards.

Contact was made with an occupant, [REDACTED] who stated he did not hear anything.

As the investigation continued, video was recovered from the [REDACTED] located at [REDACTED] on 01-08-2024. A camera was observed on the rear exterior of the [REDACTED] facing east towards [REDACTED] where the victim's [REDACTED] was located on the night of the homicide.

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The camera footage showed the victim's [REDACTED] parked in front of [REDACTED]. Throughout the video footage people are observed entering and exiting the vehicle and from the residence of [REDACTED]. Towards the end of the video footage, the victim's brake lights are observed flashing multiple times. the driver's door of the [REDACTED] opened up and the victim exited the vehicle and walked towards the rear of the vehicle and stood there. The driver's door opened up again and the suspect exited the vehicle. The victim ran to the sidewalk as the suspect walked towards the rear driver's side of the vehicle. The victim then hid on the side of another dark colored vehicle parked to the south of the [REDACTED] which is behind the [REDACTED]. The suspect walked to the driver's side door, turned around and walked towards the sidewalk where the victim was hiding. The suspect and the victim appeared to go back and forth trying to find/evade each other around the dark colored vehicle parked south of the [REDACTED]. The victim then ran south on [REDACTED] and out of camera view. The suspect walked back to the driver's door and re-entered the [REDACTED]. The suspect exited the driver's door of the [REDACTED] and walked to the sidewalk and looked south towards where the victim had run. The suspect then went inside [REDACTED]. Shortly afterwards, an unknown individual was observed exiting [REDACTED] and walked northbound on [REDACTED] out of camera view.

On 01-29-2024 at approximately [REDACTED] detectives responded to the [REDACTED] to contact [REDACTED] in regard to the homicide of [REDACTED].

It was learned through a witness statement from [REDACTED] that she overheard a conversation between [REDACTED] and the suspect, Janee "Star" Green, where Janee Green admitted to killing the victim, [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised the [REDACTED].

Contact was made with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] identified myself and asked [REDACTED] if he had any information in regard to the investigation.

[REDACTED] stated that he has known "Janee Davis" for 15 years. [REDACTED] described her as [REDACTED] that he met from knowing [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that sometime in the past two weeks he was working in the morning at the [REDACTED]. Janee was standing at the counter and was high and stated that she killed a guy named [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] wasn't paying too much attention because she appeared high and had a crack pipe in her hand [REDACTED] and that is when he started to believe what she said.

On 01-31-2024, the affiant received a phone call from [REDACTED] who advised that "Janee Davis", the suspect, was standing outside the [REDACTED] and was wearing a pink coat and blue jeans. The affiant contacted officers via police radio and gave the location and description of the suspect. Shortly later, the suspect was taken into custody by officers. The suspect identified herself as Janee Davis [REDACTED].

Janee Davis was transported to 1125 Locust Street, Police Headquarters, to be interviewed. Ms. Davis was read her Miranda Warning and Waiver and agreed to speak with detectives.

Ms. Davis stated that she was flagged down by the victim at [REDACTED] on 01-03-2024. She stated that she and the victim rode around Linwood Blvd and Prospect Avenue stealing drugs from drug dealers. Ms. Davis stated that the victim would offer her to the drug dealers to perform sexual services for "dope" and then they

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would take the "dope" and then not perform the sexual service. Ms. Davis advised that the victim called [REDACTED] she knew [REDACTED] (location of the crime scene) to set up a deal for sexual services with him for exchange of "dope." Ms. Davis identified "dope" as crack cocaine. The victim was not aware that she knew [REDACTED]. Ms. Davis stated that throughout the car ride with the victim, he had her perform oral sex on him. Once they arrived at the [REDACTED] she knew came outside [REDACTED] and brought "dope" to the vehicle. Ms. Davis stated that she went inside the residence to get her own "dope" because the victim would not share his. Ms. Davis returned to the victim's vehicle where he attempted to get her to perform oral sex on him. Ms. Davis stated that the victim pulled out a knife and it was sitting on his lap. Ms. Davis refused to perform oral sex on the victim and she told him to give her some of the dope he took from the man in the house. The victim slapped Ms. Davis multiple times while his hand was holding the knife in his lap. Ms. Davis refused to let the victim use her "pipe" (a devise used to inhale narcotics) and refused to be "his girl" (a reference to the victim becoming Ms. Davis' pimp). It should be noted that Ms. Davis claimed to have met the victim for the first time on the night of the incident. Ms. Davis stated that she was angry about victim grabbing her arm, attempting to force her to perform oral sex, and not sharing his "dope." She took the victim's knife and tucked it under her right arm and held it for about a minute. She stated that the victim stated "I'm playin' with you but I got different things." Ms. Davis stated that she thought he was talking about getting a gun. Ms. Davis stated that while she still had the knife, the victim hit her with the back said of his open right hand and then she stabbed him 4 times. Ms. Davis stated that after she stabbed the victim he exited out of the driver's side of the vehicle and then she exited out of the driver's side of the vehicle (which corroborated what was observed on surveillance video). She stated that she attempted to look for him to see if he was okay. Ms. Davis then stated that she went inside the house and tried to telepathically tell the individual inside the house to get help. Ms. Davis then left the house and went to [REDACTED] where she stated that she got rid of the knife in a sewer and that it would be in the Missouri River.

Detectives obtained city camera footage from the night of the incident of the [REDACTED] on the night of the incident which showed Ms. Davis approaching the driver's side of the victim's vehicle and then getting inside of the victim's vehicle and leaving the [REDACTED] together. Ms. Davis was shown a still photograph of that city camera footage to which she confirmed was her meeting the victim and getting in his vehicle. Ms. Davis was shown a photograph of [REDACTED] to which she stated that was the residence she went inside of. Ms. Davis was shown a photograph of [REDACTED] who she stated was the individual inside the residence of [REDACTED]. Ms. Davis was shown a photograph of the victim's [REDACTED] parked in front of [REDACTED] to which she stated was the victim's vehicle.

On 01-31-2024 a search warrant was granted by the Jackson County Circuit Court for [REDACTED]. Upon service of the search warrant contact was made with [REDACTED] told detectives that on the night of the incident he received a phone call from the victim. The victim told [REDACTED] that he was out of gasoline. [REDACTED] stated that he went to the victim's vehicle and spoke with the victim, but did not see anyone else inside of the vehicle. [REDACTED] there was a female that he knows as [REDACTED] who was in and out of the house, and used the restroom and left. [REDACTED] was shown a DOR photograph of Janee Davis [REDACTED] who he positively identified as the female he knows as [REDACTED].
