The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 04/01/2021 at 1323 hours, Officers from the Kansas City Missouri Police Department were dispatched to **2715 Van Brunt Boulevard, Kansas City, Jackson County Missouri**, regarding a disturbance with a weapon. Upon arrival, Officers observed a Silver Volkswagen Jetta leaving the parking lot, with the rear passenger door partially open. The vehicle was followed, and a traffic stop was performed at E. 24th Street and Hardesty Avenue, after a short vehicle pursuit. Officers met with Victim [REDACTED] who stated [REDACTED], **WALKER, Lydell R. (B/M 11/22/1969)** pointed a gun at her, forced her into the Silver Volkswagen, and took her money and phone. [REDACTED] stated the Volkswagen was driven by [REDACTED]. ([REDACTED]). Officers met with victim [REDACTED], who stated WALKER pointed the gun at his head, and pulled the trigger. WALKER then forced [REDACTED] into a vehicle, which was driven away from the store by a female.

When officers performed the traffic stop on the silver 2001 Volkswagen Jetta (MO LP 072N3L) [REDACTED] was the driver, WALKER was the front passenger, [REDACTED] was the right rear passenger, and [REDACTED] was in the rear driver's side of the vehicle [REDACTED] and WALKER were placed under arrest and transported to East Patrol Detention. [REDACTED] officers where WALKER threw the gun out of the car, and [REDACTED] threw a pink bag out of the car. Officers recovered a black Ruger LCP pistol (serial number 372417714), and the pink bag at 25th Street and Hardesty Avenue. The pink bag contained the magazine, with seven live rounds, and a white powder and clear crystal substance that tested positive for the presence of methamphetamine. The methamphetamine weighed approximately 4.27 grams (with packaging).

[REDACTED] stated the following: She [REDACTED] WALKER for [REDACTED] hs. During those [REDACTED], WALKER has been abusive towards [REDACTED], but she never called police or filed a

report. On 03/31/2021, WALKER stole [REDACTED] money that she had remaining from her stimulus check. [REDACTED] was aware that WALKER stole her money and she waited for WALKER to fall asleep so that she could take her money back. On 04/01/2021 at approximately 0600 hours, [REDACTED] woke up, took her money back and left the residence located at 521 E Winner Rd, without WALKER knowing. [REDACTED] stated that when she took her money back, some of WALKER's money was mixed in with hers. Around 1100 hours, [REDACTED] went to Metro PCS located at 2715 Van Brunt to get a new phone because she stated that WALKER had stolen all of her personal data. While she was outside talking with the [REDACTED], WALKER arrived in a silver older model four door vehicle with [REDACTED], who was driving and [REDACTED], who was the rear passenger. WALKER got out of the vehicle, pointed a black handgun at [REDACTED] chest and demanded her to get into the vehicle. Initially, [REDACTED] told WALKER no and refused to get into the vehicle. While WALKER was trying to force [REDACTED] into the vehicle, [REDACTED] was telling WALKER to take [REDACTED]'s phone and money. In fear of getting shot, [REDACTED] stop resisting and got into the vehicle. Once inside the vehicle, WALKER gave [REDACTED] the money he took from [REDACTED] placed the money in a pink [REDACTED] was telling WALKER and [REDACTED] to let [REDACTED] go and [REDACTED] to drive. Seconds later, officers pulled up behind them and [REDACTED] drove off refusing to stop. While [REDACTED] was eluding police, [REDACTED] observed [REDACTED] throw a pink bag out of the driver's window and WALKER threw a black handgun out of the passenger's window. [REDACTED] finally came to a stop and was taken into to custody with WALKER. [REDACTED] stated that she was not injured during the incident.

[REDACTED] stated the following: [REDACTED] came into her place of employment, Metro PCS, located at 2715 Van Brunt Blvd, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri to get a new phone. [REDACTED] is a regular customer and went into the business where she purchased a phone. [REDACTED] assisted CCD in transferring data from her old phone into her new one. Once the old data was transferred into [REDACTED] new phone, she, [REDACTED] all went outside where they continued to assist [REDACTED] with her phone. [REDACTED] informed [REDACTED] that she was going to walk to the store. As she proceeded to the store, she observed a silver car pull up in front of her and park on the side of her, barricading her in. Once the car came to a complete stop, the driver [REDACTED] exited the vehicle along with [REDACTED], who was sitting behind [REDACTED] in the car. Moments later, a black man later identified as Lydell WALKER exited the front right passenger side of the vehicle with his right hand inside his right pocket. WALKER proceeded to walk towards where [REDACTED] were both standing. After making contact with the two, WALKER pulled out a black handgun and pointed it a [REDACTED] head and pulled the trigger once, but no round discharged because it was a dry fire. WALKER then pointed the gun at [REDACTED] and stated the following, "Bitch where is my money!" WALKER than began to bea [REDACTED] with the gun. WALKER pointed the gun at [REDACTED] a second time, before attempting to force [REDACTED] into the vehicle. [REDACTED] attempted to get away, but each time she did [REDACTED] who had gotten back inside the vehicle, would drive the vehicle forward or backwards to prevent [REDACTED] from getting away. [REDACTED] appeared to be trying to block [REDACTED] in as well, but with her body, as WALKER continued assaulting [REDACTED]. WALKER attempted to force [REDACTED] into the car multiple times by pushing her, hitting her and pulling her hair, but each time she was able to fight him off while telling him she did not want to get into the car. Finally WALKER was able to get [REDACTED] into the car. Before they drove away from the scene, WALKER told [REDACTED] that when they were finished with [REDACTED] they were coming back for them. Once they were inside the vehicle, [REDACTED] drove away. [REDACTED] described WALKER to be wearing a red wave cap, black sweat suit with letters on the front of the jacket and red lines going down the sides of the pants.

[REDACTED] following: [REDACTED] the Metro by T-Mobile, which is located at 2715 Van Brunt Boulevard, Kansas City, Jackson County Missouri. On 04/01/2021, [REDACTED] helping a customer he knew as

██████████ (later determined to be ██████████) They were standing in front of the store, at 2715 Van Brunt Boulevard. ██████████ knows ██████████ as a customer, who comes in to the store for new telephones, and to pay her bill. ██████████ stated a silver four door vehicle pulled up, and a black male, J. ██████████ recognized as a person who comes into the store with ██████████ exited the front passenger seat of the car and approached them. The male (later identified by ██████████ as WALKER) pointed a gun at ██████████ stated he recognized the gun as a black Ruger .380. WALKER began to yell, "You took my money, bitch!" and grabbed and hit ██████████ with the gun. WALKER then pointed the gun at ██████████ face, and pulled the trigger. ██████████ stated he heard the gun "click," but it did not go off. WALKER pointed the gun back and forth between ██████████ and ██████████ WALKER was approximately three feet away from JAP when he pointed the gun at him. WALKER then forced ██████████ to walk over to the vehicle he had arrived in, which was occupied by a skinny white female driver (later identified by ██████████ as DAILEY) and a heavy set white or Hispanic female on the rear driver's side (later identified as ██████████) ██████████ attempted to get away, and the driver, ██████████ pulled the car backward and forward, preventing her from escaping. WALKER then grabbed ██████████ and forced her to get into the rear passenger side of the vehicle ██████████ stated he heard the sounds of sirens, and the silver vehicle drove away with ██████████ inside. ██████████ stated WALKER said, "After we kill this bitch, we are coming back for you two!" as they drove away.

AMR stated the following: ██████████ came over to some apartments to talk to a girl that ██████████ knows. As they were talking, ██████████ made a statement about needing a ride to her son's residence located at 2632 Denver Ave. When ██████████ left, she called ██████████ on the phone and informed her that she could give her a ride to her son's residence ██████████ had not contacted her son and was going to surprise him with money since he had asked for it the day prior. When ██████████ picked her up, WALKER aka "Dallas" was inside the vehicle in the front right passenger side seat. After they arrived at her son's residence, she discovered that he was not home. They left his residence and proceeded to take her back to her previous location. As they were driving, WALKER spotted his girlfriend ██████████ standing outside of the Metro PCS store located on 2715 Van Brunt Blvd. WALKER told ██████████ to pull the car over because he was pissed at ██████████ because he alleged that she stole \$800 of his stimulus check. After ██████████ pulled the car over, WALKER exited the car and with his right hand, pointed a black handgun at ██████████ and another man identified as ██████████ WALKER then forced ██████████ into the car with him pointing the gun to her chest and her pleading to him that she did not want to get in the car. WALKER told ██████████ the following, "Get your ass in or imma pop you!" ██████████ stated on the street, the word "pop" meant to "shoot." After ██████████ got into the car on the right rear passenger side, WALKER got into the vehicle on the right front passenger side. ██████████ drove away from the scene and as she drove, WALKER continued to yell at ██████████ While ██████████ drove, the police turned on their lights and sirens and at that time, WALKER threw his black handgun out the passenger side window. ██████████ did not know who threw the pink bag out of the window. ██████████ refused to stop the car right away, but eventually pulled the car over. ██████████ was unaware that the incident was going to occur, but felt like ██████████ knew what WALKER was going to ██████████ acknowledged that she speculated that WALKER was a felon given that he had told her he had done twenty years in prison. ██████████ as being very frightened.

On 04-01-2021 at 2130 hours, Detectives responded to East Patrol Detention to obtain a recorded statement from WALKER. At 2138 hours, WALKER was read his Miranda Rights and verbally acknowledged that he understood his rights. WALKER agreed to speak with detectives and stated the following: On the day of the incident, he was at his residence with his girlfriend ██████████. At some point he went to sleep, and when he woke up he discovered that his front door was open and ██████████ was gone. When he checked his pants pocket, he discovered

that his \$900 from his stimulus check was missing. He figured [REDACTED] took because she was the only person that knew he had the money. [REDACTED] randomly showed up at his residence, but left soon after to go to her friend "IDA'S" residence. While at "IDA'S," [REDACTED] spoke to [REDACTED] who advised her that she knew where [REDACTED] was located. [REDACTED], WALKER and [REDACTED] all drove around looking for [REDACTED]. At some point, [REDACTED] spotted [REDACTED] at the Metro PCS store and drove up to the store. [REDACTED] then handed WALKER a black handgun, at which time he exited the vehicle and approached [REDACTED]. Once he made contact with [REDACTED] he pointed the black handgun at WALKER and told her he would kill her if she did not give him back his money. He also pointed the handgun at [REDACTED] and told him to back away. WALKER forced [REDACTED] into the vehicle and [REDACTED] drove away. After [REDACTED] drove away, the police attempted to stop the vehicle, but she kept driving. [REDACTED] asked WALKER if anyone had anything on them. WALKER then passed the handgun to [REDACTED] and she threw it out the window because he could not roll his window down since it was taped up. WALKER did not know who the pink bag belonged to. WALKER acknowledged that he is a felon.

I request that a warrant be issued for WALKER's arrest with a bond associated with that warrant. WALKER is a threat to [REDACTED] because they are in a romantic relationship and have resided together. WALKER has demonstrated erratic and violent behavior towards [REDACTED] and threatened to return to the offense location and harm [REDACTED]. WALKER has also showed violent behavior in the past when he was convicted of the following: On or about 04/17/1996 WALKER was convicted for possession of a controlled substance out of Jackson County on case number CR952535. WALKER was sentenced to three years' confinement. On or about 03/11/2002 WALKER was convicted of first degree rape and lewd or indecent acts to a child out of Creek County Oklahoma on case number CF-2001-00096. WALKER was sentenced to twenty years' confinement.
