The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 05-18-2024 at 1414 hours, Officers of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [REDACTED] Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri, on a reported shooting. Upon arrival, officers located a male victim lying on the ground. Fire EMS responded to the scene and pronounced the victim deceased.

A witness told officers the suspects were two Hispanic males, with one of the males being heavier set and wearing a blue shirt. The witness told officers the suspects ran west through the courtyard after the shooting. While attempting to locate the suspects, officers located [REDACTED] and Charles Harrison Jr. exiting the apartment building at [REDACTED]. Officers observed Harrison Jr taking off his blue shirt as he exited the building. Officers placed [REDACTED] and Harrison Jr. under arrest. After being placed under arrest, Harrison Jr. spontaneously uttered that the guns were under a mat inside the apartment building they had just exited ([REDACTED]). Officers responded to [REDACTED] and located two handguns underneath a mat under a stairwell.

[REDACTED] was transported to Police Headquarters, 1125 Locust Street. Detectives contacted [REDACTED] and after being advised of his Miranda Rights, stated his son, Harrison Jr's Dodge Charger Hellcat had been stolen earlier in the day (Raytown PD CRN 24-1304). Harrison Jr. told [REDACTED] he was tracking the location of his stolen vehicle, and asked for [REDACTED] help retrieving it. [REDACTED] agreed, and they left together occupying his wife's black 2007 Toyota Camry. [REDACTED] stated he saw his son's vehicle at the apartment complex, and upon seeing it, stopped, and did not approach it. [REDACTED] stated there were four black males standing near the stolen vehicle, and two of the males started walking toward his Camry. As the two males began walking toward his Camry, Harrison Jr. retrieved a handgun from the glove compartment. [REDACTED] stated one of the males was holding onto a handgun as he approached. [REDACTED] stated he feared he was about to be shot and ducked down as he heard gunshots. [REDACTED] stated his foot slipped off the break, causing the vehicle to accelerate and run over the victim. [REDACTED] exited his vehicle and saw the victim lying on the ground. Harrison stated that after the initial shooting, a male from the south and two from the north began shooting at them. [REDACTED] and Harrison Jr. ran to take cover in an apartment building nearby. While inside the building,

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██████████ told Harrison Jr. to hide the guns under a mat. ██████████ stated one of the two guns they his belonged to the victim, but could not remember if he of Harrison Jr. removed the gun from the victim.

Charles Harrison Jr. was transported to Police Headquarters, 1125 Locust Street. Detectives contacted Harrison Jr., and after being advised of his Miranda Rights, stated his Dodge Charger was stolen earlier in the day in Raytown, Missouri. Harrison used a tracking device to track his vehicle to E 34th Street and Wyoming Street. Harrison Jr. and ██████████ used a vehicle belonging to the mother of Harrison Jr. to drive to the location 34th and Wyoming St. Once they got to the location, Harrison Jr. could see his stolen vehicle, with four black males standing near the vehicle. ██████████ parked their vehicle in a parking spot to not get too close to the Dodge Charger. Harrison Jr. stated two shirtless black males who were standing by the Charger, began walking toward them. One of the males had his hand on a gun that was tucked into his waistband. Harrison Jr. told ██████████ “Let’s go”, as Harrison Jr. retrieved a handgun, a Glock 10mm, from the glove compartment. Harrison Jr. stated ██████████ said “No, I’m going to run them over”, then proceeded to accelerate forward. Harrison Jr. stated that if he was not mistaken, the victim pulled a gun from his waistband, so Harrison Jr. fired three times from inside the passenger seat of the vehicle. Harrison Jr. then stated he could not remember if the victim pulled the gun out or if he just had his hand on the gun. After the victim was run over, Harrison Jr. and ██████████ began getting shot at from people who were still by the Charger and by someone to the south. Harrison Jr. picked up a handgun that the victim had in his possession, a Glock 9mm. Harrison Jr. began returning fire, firing approximately 10 times with the Glock 10mm and three or four times with the Glock 9mm he took from the victim. Harrison Jr. and ██████████ proceeded to run to an apartment building. While inside an apartment building, Harrison Jr. hid the gun from the glove compartment and the gun retrieved from the victim, underneath a mat.

Detectives of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department’s Homicide Unit – 1030 Squad, were notified and responded to the scene. Detectives observed a black Toyota Camry bearing Missouri license ██████████ parked in front of the victim. The vehicle had three apparent bullet holes through the front windshield on the passenger side, and apparent blood on the front and driver side. Several 9mm and 10mm spent casings were located near the vehicle.

Detectives observed surveillance video from the apartment complex, which shows the black Toyota Camry parking in a parking spot then almost immediately backing out. Once the vehicle backs out it stops, and the victim and witness #1, the victim’s brother, are seen walking toward the front of the vehicle. Both the victim’s and witness #1’s hands appear empty as they walk toward the Toyota Camry. As the two get closer to the vehicle, the victim appears to have his right hand on the outside of the front right pocket of his jeans, apparently holding something in his pocket. As the victim and witness #1 come within a few feet of the front of the vehicle, the vehicle accelerates and turns toward the victim, causing witness #1 to jump away and the victim to lift his arms, at which time, the victim hands can be seen empty. As the vehicle began its acceleration toward the victim, apparent gunfire can be seen going through the windshield of the Camry. The vehicle strikes and runs over the victim with the front and rear driver side tires. The vehicle stops a few feet away from the victim, and Harrison Jr., wearing a blue shirt, exits the vehicle armed with an apparent handgun. Harrison Jr. walks toward the victim and removes an object from the victim. Harrison Jr. and ██████████ can be seen taking cover behind the Camry and Harrison Jr. can be seen firing a handgun, before running until out of the cameras view.

Detectives observed the victim to have two apparent gunshot wounds, one to his head and one to his back.
