

committed the class E felony of property damage in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about September 10, 2024, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly damaged a rear exterior metal door, which property was owned by [REDACTED] by attempting to pry the door open, and the damages to such property exceeded seven hundred and fifty dollars.

The range punishment for a class E felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than one (1) year and not to exceed four (4) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

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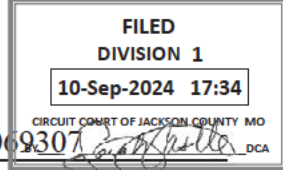

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 09/10/2024, Kansas City Missouri Police Officers responded to 7320 Wornall Road, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri (BE Tek) in regard to a non-residential burglary.

Upon arrival they contacted (reporting party) who stated a rear exterior metal door was damaged which would cost approximately \$6000 to fix based off an estimate from previous damage. The rear door damage was caused by someone trying to pry it open. A coax cable was also damaged stated the incident was captured on video and he provided it to Metro Property Crimes Detectives.

On 09/10/2024, Kansas City Missouri Police Officers were dispatched to 901 East 75th Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri on a reported suspicious prowler. While enroute, dispatch updated the address to at 7500 Wornall Road, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

When Officers arrived they observed a black newer model pickup truck facing north parked in the pharmacy drive thru window of the Officers activated their emergency equipment and the black pickup truck fled at a high rate of speed through the parking lot then northbound from East 75th Street/Wornall Road, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri.

Officers contacted (witness) who stated he arrived to 501 West 75th Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri to deliver product at approximately 0315 hours. When he arrived to he observed a black pickup truck parked in the drive thru of the Walgreen's with multiple parties climbing through the drive thru window. stated the parties had already broken the glass to the drive thru window prior to his arrival observed the males exiting the drive thru window with five to six large bags full of what he believed to be prescription drugs. When the Officers arrived, he observed the male in red shoes and another male in dark clothing take off on foot southbound from the location. He recorded the incident on his cell phone.

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Officers observed the drive thru window to be shattered and multiple prescription bottles on the ground outside of the window. They also observed a large trash bags full of prescription pills on the counter just inside of the drive thru window.

Other Officers responded to the area to conduct an area canvass for the suspects who fled on foot. Sergeant Nelson observed two black males enter the rear area of the residence located at 7540 Pennsylvania Avenue, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. Sergeant Nelson stated the suspects were a black male wearing a gray and black hooded sweatshirt (Suspect 1) and a black male wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt, gray shirt, gray pants, and red shoes (Suspect 2). Sergeant Nelson detained a party matching the description of suspect 2 at 7535 Jefferson Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. He was identified as **George Carter, black male, 09/03/2001**.

Generalist Squad Detectives were notified from the scene and advised to place **Carter** on a 24 hour investigative hold for non-residential burglary. He was transported to Metro Patrol Detention. Crime Scene responded to the location and processed the scene. They advised there was apparently blood inside of Walgreen's.

Officers recovered one gray hooded sweatshirt and one gray and black hooded sweatshirt. Inside the gray hooded sweatshirt, they located a black flashlight.

Officers contacted [REDACTED] (other) who is the homeowner of [REDACTED] Pennsylvania Avenue who advised she had RING camera footage of a black male in a grey hooded sweatshirt, grey pants, and red shoes attempting to enter her residence. The RING video was provided to Detectives who reviewed it and observed the male in the video to be **Carter**.

Video was provided to Metro Property Crimes Detectives from BE Tek and Walgreen's of both incidents from 09/10/2024. In the video a male wearing a grey hoodie, grey pants with white stripes and zippers on the side, and red Nike shoes can be observed as one of the suspects committing the crimes. In both incidents a black pickup truck was the suspect vehicle.

On 09/10/2024, Kansas City Missouri Police Department Metro Property Crimes Detective Kincaid and Officer N. Hall responded to Metro Detention to interview **Carter**. Detective Kincaid observed **Carter** to be wearing a grey long sleeve shirt, grey pants with white stripes and zippers on the side and red Nike tennis shoes. These clothing items and shoes matched the suspect clothing in the property damage incident and the non-residential burglary incident videos.

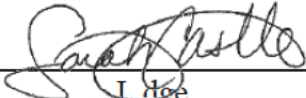
Post Miranda, **Carter** stated he wasn't doing anything overnight. He then stated he was all over. When shown photographs of a male in the exact same clothing and shoes he was wearing damaging property at 7320 Wornall Road and breaking into [REDACTED] at 7500 Wornall Road, he stated it wasn't him and he didn't know anything about it. Detective Kincaid also observed **Carter** to have two small cuts on the palm of his right hand.
