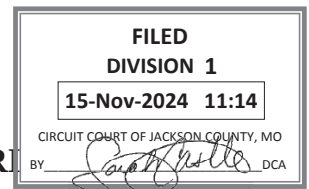

COMPLAINT
WARRANT REQUESTED

Count I. Murder 2nd Degree (565.021-001Y20200911.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the class A felony of murder in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about on or about November 14, 2024, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly or with the purpose of causing serious physical injury to Confidential Victim, caused the death of Confidential Victim by shooting him.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y20205299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section

571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about on or about November 14, 2024, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Murder in the Second Degree, as charged in Count I, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Murder in the Second Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The punishment imposed pursuant to Section 571.015, RSMo shall be in addition to and consecutive to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.1, RSMo. is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than three years and not to exceed fifteen years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term of not less than five years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.2, RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment by the department of corrections for a term of not less than five years and not to exceed thirty years, unless the person is unlawfully possessing a firearm, in which case the term of imprisonment shall be for a term not less than fifteen years. No person convicted under this subsection shall be eligible for parole, probation, conditional release, or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015.3, RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the statement(s) of facts filed contemporaneously herewith, made a part hereof, and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

(Description of Identity)

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 11/14/2024 at 1248 hours, officers with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department were dispatched to [Redacted] in regard to a shooting. Upon arrival, they located a female Galaviz, Kandi [Redacted] (suspect) who stated "I shot him". Officers placed Kandi into custody and transported her to Police Headquarters, 7th floor, interview room #1. Officers then located the victim ([Redacted]) laying on his back in the parking lot of the business. Medic 9 with the Kansas City Missouri Fire Department responded to the scene and pronounced [Redacted] at 1300 hours. A homicide investigation was initiated.

On 11/14/2024, detectives with the Kansas City Missouri Police Department's 1010 Homicide Unit responded to the scene to meet officers. Upon arrival, detectives observed a maroon Cadillac Sedan Deville parked in the parking lot of the business near the entrance on the west side of the parking lot. [Redacted] was observed lying on his back just in front of where the maroon Cadillac was parked. [Redacted] was observed to be wearing a black T-shirt, blue jeans, brown belt and black shoes with brown soles. [Redacted] was observed to have a defect to the middle of his chest and obvious blood on his shirt. Detectives located 3 Hordany 9mm spent shell casings just to the north of the maroon Cadillac in the business parking lot. During the search of the maroon Cadillac, detectives and crime scene technicians located a black Hi-Point 45 Caliber handgun, [Redacted] located in the driver's seat.

While on scene, detectives contacted [Redacted] who stated on 11/14/2024 he was working at the incident location when the suspect Kandi, [Redacted] pulled into the parking lot of the business in a maroon Cadillac sedan. Kandi, [Redacted] exited the car and [Redacted] walked up to him and said "whats up". [Redacted] stated he knew [Redacted] he was a former employee. [Redacted] asked him "what time do you get off work? I don't want you getting caught in this crossfire". After a short period of time, Kandi began to argue with [Redacted] and observed Kandi physically grabbing at [Redacted] en grabbed Kandi and pushed her down onto the car and then the ground. [Redacted] then let go and started backing away from Kandi at which time Kandi stood up and shot [Redacted]. After shooting [Redacted], he observed Kandi hand the handgun to [Redacted]

Detectives contacted [Redacted] is the owner of the maroon Cadillac. [Redacted] stated on 11/14/2024 he was giving Kandi and [Redacted] a ride around town to run errands. While running [Redacted] Kandi asked if they could stop by the

incident location to pick up their property from a vehicle that was [REDACTED] agreed and the three of them drove to the incident location. Upon arrival, he, Kandi and [REDACTED] exited his vehicle and asked [REDACTED] he could have their property. [REDACTED] stated they could and Kandi, [REDACTED] began loading their property. As they were loading their property, Kandi noticed items were missing. Kandi became angry and began to get into [REDACTED] face. He observed [REDACTED] grab Kandi and push her onto the car and then onto the ground. Both parties separated and Kandi walked towards the driver's side of his car, pulled out a gun and shot [REDACTED]

Detectives contacted [REDACTED] stated on 11/14/2024, she received a phone call from [REDACTED] who stated she needed to get to the incident location fast. While on the phone with [REDACTED] could hear Kandi yelling and screaming. [REDACTED] drove from 39th Street and Troost Avenue to the incident location. As she pulled up to the incident location, she observed Kandi pull out a gun and shoot [REDACTED]. She then parked her car just north of the incident location, ran to the business and began to perform CPR on the victim until police arrived.

Detectives contacted [REDACTED] (witness) who stated on 11/14/2024, she was riding in the car with her sister Nia when [REDACTED] a phone call from [REDACTED] telling her to come to the incident location. As they were arriving to the incident location, she heard the shots and saw [REDACTED] on the ground. Her and [REDACTED] parked north of the incident location on McGee Street and [REDACTED] ran down to the incident location.

Detectives contacted [REDACTED] (witness) who stated on 11/14/2024 he was working on a vehicle at the incident location. He began to hear a female arguing with [REDACTED] and the conversation became heated. During the argument, he heard the female say "square up and do something". The argument continued until he heard 2 to 3 gunshots. He then walked out to see what was going on and observed [REDACTED] lying on the ground in the parking lot. He then observed Kandi hand [REDACTED] black handgun with an extended magazine. He observed [REDACTED] walk out of the incident location parking lot, southbound [REDACTED]. He observed [REDACTED] up to a [REDACTED] [REDACTED] walked back over to the incident location where officers were beginning to secure the scene.

Detectives contacted [REDACTED] stated on 11/14/2024, [REDACTED] gave Kandi and him a ride around town to run errands. While running errands, he and Kandi asked if they could stop by the incident location to pick up their property from a vehicle that was reposed. [REDACTED] agreed and the three of them drove to the incident location. Upon arrival, he, Kandi and [REDACTED] exited the vehicle and [REDACTED] if they could have their property that was taken from the repossessed vehicle. [REDACTED] stated they could and they began loading up their property. [REDACTED] items were missing and said something to [REDACTED] then confronted [REDACTED] became angry about the missing items. He then saw [REDACTED] grab Kandi and push her onto the car and then onto the ground while holding her by the neck. Both parties separated and Kandi pulled out a gun and [REDACTED] Kandi then told him and [REDACTED] she wanted to leave but they [REDACTED] after the shooting Kandi put something in his pocket but he didn't know what it was.

On 11/14/2024, detectives contacted Kandi in interview room #1 on the 7th floor of Police Headquarters where she made the following statement: On 11/14/2024, she and [REDACTED] to drive them around to run errands. While running errand she and [REDACTED] to take them [REDACTED] location) to retrieve their property from a vehicle that had been [REDACTED] agreed, and the three of them drove to the incident location in [REDACTED] vehicle. Upon arriving, her [REDACTED] exited the vehicle, started gathering their property and noticed some of their property was missing. She and [REDACTED] about the missing property in which [REDACTED] responded by saying I don't have it, you need to figure it out. During the conversation Kandi stated she was poking [REDACTED] the back of the head. The conversation turned into an argument at which point [REDACTED] toward her saying "don't try it, don't try it". She felt [REDACTED] was going to hurt her so she shoved him. [REDACTED] grabbed her, pinned her arm behind her back and shoved her into the car and then the ground. [REDACTED] got off of her and stepped

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approximately 5 feet away from her. She got to her feet, retrieved [REDACTED] from her pocket and shot [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] the ground and she [REDACTED] gun. She was not sure what John did with the gun, she just knew [REDACTED] 911.

Detectives located surveillance footage of the incident at [REDACTED] which revealed the following information: On 11/14/2024 at 12:27:57 hours, a maroon Cadillac sedan pulls in to the parking lot of the incident location. At 12:28:08 hours, [REDACTED] is observed exiting the front passenger seat of the vehicle and contacting an employee working in the parking lot. At 12:28:20 hours, J [REDACTED] walks across the parking lot and appears to talk with another employee in the parking lot. At 12:28:40 [REDACTED] walks out of camera view and reenters camera view at 12:29:30 carrying objects in his arms. [REDACTED] n walks up to the maroon Cadillac sedan he arrived in and places item in the driver side back passenger seat at 12:29:38. At 12:29:48 hours, Kandi is observed exiting the back-passenger side seat. Between 12:29:48 hours and 12:39:35 hours, [REDACTED] and Kandi continue to load their belongings into the maroon Cadillac. At 12:39:35 [REDACTED] is observed walking into camera frame and walking up to the maroon Cadillac [REDACTED] and Kandi are standing and then walks away towards the business. At 12:43:21 hours [REDACTED] is observed walking back into camera frame and begins to have a conversation with Kandi, [REDACTED] At 12:45:04 hours, [REDACTED] and Kandi walk to the front of the maroon Cadillac and continue to talk. At 12:46:52 hours, Kandi appears to push [REDACTED] which [REDACTED] appears to push Kandi into the front of the maroon Cadillac and then to the ground. At 12:47:04 [REDACTED] to let Kandi go and begin to back away from her. At 12:47:05 Kandi appears to stand up and take a step backwards. At the same time, [REDACTED] to the ground and does not get up. At 12:47:13 hours, Kandi then walks around the back of the maroon Cadillac and gets in the back-passenger seat where [REDACTED] in front of the open door. At 12:47:31 Kandi shuts the back-passenger door and [REDACTED] into the front passenger seat. [REDACTED] observed standing at the back-driver side passenger seat. Kandi, [REDACTED] are observed entering and exiting the vehicle until police arrive at 12:50:56 hours.
