The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

Date: 03-06-2016

On 03-05-2016 at 1355 hours, Officers of the Kansas City Missouri Police Department were dispatched to 1521 Lawn Ave on a reported suspicious car and occupant armed with a gun. Upon arrival, Officers contacted the victim, LAH, who stated her boyfriend, Hakeem K. Harris B/M 11-22-1990, has assaulted her and held her against her will.

LAH stated the following: She was at her home in her bedroom when Harris came over demanding his gun. She told him she didn't have his gun. He began to search her bedroom demanding his gun. Harris grabbed her around the neck with both hands and began to strangle her to the point her eyesight became blurred and she was unable to breath. When he released his grip he hit her in the face. She grabbed her inhaler and used it to help her breath. She suffers from asthma. Harris grabbed her again around her neck with both hands and began strangling her. He let her go and went into another room. When he came back into her bedroom he had a large knife with a red handle and black blade belonging to LAH. He put the knife to her throat and threatened to kill her if she didn't produce his gun. She pleaded with him and told him she would replace it if he would take her to her mother's house to get money. LAH stated Harris took her son's TV and Playstation and put it into her vehicle. He made her get into her vehicle, 2005 Chevy Impala VIN#2G1WF52EX59283298, and he drove off with her. She stated they drove around for 30 minutes or more, stopped at a gas station near Independence Ave and Paseo where he made her get out and pay for the gas. Harris had the knife at his right side the whole time in the car and LAH stated she was scared to leave him because he had threatened to kill her son. He then took her to her mother's house at 1521 Lawn Ave Kansas City Missouri. Harris stayed in the vehicle and LAH walked up to her mother's house, went inside and called police. LAH stated Harris kept her against her will for approximately 2 hours.

Witness, ZAB, stated the following: LAH, her daughter, had called her and stated Harris was over at her house "trippin". She had gotten off the phone with LAH and tried to call her back several times but LAH wouldn't answer. ZAB got very worried and began calling family members. ZAB's niece called LAH and spoke with her. Her niece stated LAH kept saying the word "smurf" and LAH's son advised them "smurf" is a code

word the family uses for "emergency" or means that person is in trouble. LAH finally showed up at ZAB's house with Harris. Harris stayed in the vehicle while LAH went inside her mother's house pretending to get money from her for Harris. ZAB handed LAH the phone to call the police. Harris began driving by the house a few times until he finally left the area in LAH's vehicle.

On 03-05-2016 at 1920 hours, Officers observed the 2005 Chevy Impala belonging to LAH. Harris got into the vehicle and drove off. Officers initiated their lights and siren to stop Harris when he sped off at a high rate of speed running 3 red traffic control signals and becoming involved in a collision with three other vehicles at the third light. Harris was not injured. He was arrested and transported to Jackson County Detention Center for questioning. Harris was read his Miranda Rights and agreed to speak with detectives. Harris denied having a gun or attempting to get a gun. Harris denied strangling LAH, putting a knife to her throat and holding her against her will. He admitted to taking LAH's son's TV and Playstation but stated he bought them. Harris admitted the 2005 Chevy Impala was registered in LAH's name but stated it is his vehicle. He stated LAH couldn't find her car keys so she asked him for a ride to her mother's house. He stated they stopped at a gas station on the way to her mother's house at Independence Ave and Troost, however, LAH lives at 5506 E 39<sup>th</sup> St and the gas station is geographically out of the way from LAH's mother's house at 1521 Lawn Ave.

Harris is a Missouri convicted felon for Robbery and Armed Criminal Action. Harris poses a threat to the victim, her family members and the general public.

## Count I. Kidnapping - Facilitating A Felony Or Flight Thereafter/inflicting Injury/terrorizing Victim (565.110-002Y19501099.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.110, RSMo, committed the class B felony of kidnapping, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about March 5, 2016, in the county of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant unlawfully confined without her consent for a substantial period, for the purpose of terrorizing

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years.

### **Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)**

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about March 5, 2016, in the county of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of kidnapping charged in Count One, all allegations of which are

incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of kidnapping by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a dangerous instrument.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a second offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of five (5) calendar years. The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. as a third offense is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of ten (10) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

# Count III. Resisting Arrest/detention/stop By Fleeing - Creating A Substantial Risk Of Serious Injury/death To Any Person (575.150-002Y20054801.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 575.150, RSMo, committed the class D felony of resisting a lawful stop, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 560.011, RSMo, in that on or about March 5, 2016, in the county of Jackson, State of Missouri, Carter Truax and Jared Fugate, law enforcement officers, were attempting to make a lawful stop of a vehicle being operated by the defendant, and the defendant knew or reasonably should have known that the officers were making a lawful stop, and, for the purpose of preventing the officers from effecting the stop, resisted the stop of defendant by fleeing from the officers, and the defendant fled in such a manner that created a substantial risk of serious physical injury or death to other persons in that the defendant operated a motor vehicle on Hardesty at a high rate of speed and collided with another motor vehicle after running a red light.

The range punishment for a class D felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than two (2) years and not to exceed four (4) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime up to a maximum of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000).

### Count IV. Driving While Revoked/suspended - 1st Offense (302.321-003Y20115499.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 302.321, RSMo, committed the unclassified misdemeanor of driving while license was suspended, punishable upon conviction

under Sections 302.321, 558.011 and 560.016, RSMo, in that on or about March 5, 2016, in the county of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant operated a motor vehicle on a highway, 5401 Winner Road, during a time when the defendant's operator's license was suspended under the laws of this state, and acted with criminal negligence with respect to knowledge of the fact that the defendant's operator's license was suspended.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.
