Count I. Murder 2nd Degree (565.021-001Y19840904.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the class A felony of murder in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about September 19, 2016, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant with the purpose of causing serious physical injury to J.R. caused the death of J.R. by shooting him.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about September 19, 2016, in the county of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Murder in the Second Degree charged in Count 1, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Murder in the Second Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

Date: 9/19/2016 Report #: 2016-71698 I, E. Knox, a Detective with the Independence, Missouri, Police Department, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true. 1. I have probable cause to believe that on 9/19/2016, at 1440 Hours, Tymon Derrick Reed, (Race- BLACK, Sex- MALE, DOB- 06-19-96, Address-421 Porter Ridge Road, Kearney, Missouri, SSN-market Committed one or more criminal offenses in Jackson County, Missouri. 2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows: On 09-19-16 at 1440 hours, Officer Hankins and Officer Parris were dispatched to the area of Truman Road and Home Avenue in reference to a report of gunshots fired in the area. Dispatch informed them they received reports of juveniles running in the area after the gunshots were heard. Officer Hankins said upon his arrival he was directed to the driveway of 1106 S. Home Avenue. Officer Gilbertson was in the driveway with the victim, J. R. (10-14-99). Officer Hankins observed and and performing CPR on the victim. Officer Hankins noted the victim did not appear responsive. He observed the victim to have what appeared to be a gunshot wound to his upper right chest. Officer Hankins observed two male juveniles, and an adult female, standing in the driveway and they advised they were involved in the situation. Detective Knox and Detective Breshears interviewed at police headquarters. She said she got out of school around 1423 hours and she hung around for a little bit. She said she then walked with the victim, t guys had some issues with an and and that the victim was friends with. She said they thought they guys were supposed to meet up with or said before they could cross the street there was bench and the two guys were sitting on it. She said the Defendant approached them and kept saying "what's up". She said they tried to avoid confrontation with them so they tried turning and walking away. She said the guys followed them and the Defendant tried to fight the victim. She said the Defendant kept saying to the victim to fight him and to keep walking. She said the Defendant kept pushing the victim and the victim refused to walk. She put her hand under her shirt as if she was acting out the Defendant reaching for a gun. She said the Defendant kept backing the victim up on Home Avenue. She said the Defendant pulled the gun, put it to his side and asked the victim "you not gonna do what". She said the Defendant then pointed the gun at the victim's foot and told him to keep walking. said as the Defendant was backing the victim up the other guy was standing there. She and all of them started walking toward the victim. She said the Defendant told to "back up little bitch". At that point, the victim tried to wrestle the gun out of the Defendant's hand. She said the Defendant shot and she could hear the victim yelling "ahh, ahh". everyone scattered and she observed the victim limping and running at the same time. She said

the Defendant kept shooting and the victim must have been hit in his back or side because he dropped right there. She said the victim was running away when the Defendant was still

shooting.

POLO logo, designer jeans, white Nike Air Force One shoes and said his hair had twisties or pony tails on top and the back of his hair was cut low. also provided Detective Knox with her cell phone which contained two videos she recorded during the incident. The videos contained the Defendant and the victim.
Witness did not know who the Defendant or other black male were either. He said just prior to the shooting the victim tried to fend off the Defendant. He said the victim pushed the Defendant and tried to pick him up and throw him so they could escape. When he heard two or three gunshots fired after the initial gunshot he took off running for safety.
Detective Breshears interviewed at police headquarters. said he was in the area of Truman Rd and Home Ave earlier in the day after school and witnessed the confrontation between the victim and other subjects that ultimately led to the shooting and murder of the victim.
said he recognized the suspect that ultimately shot the victim as an acquaintance from the YMCA in North Kansas City. said he used to play basketball there with the subject and knew him as the said he had known him for around a year. He said he communicated with "the said he Snap Chat social network. said said said said said said said said
A Google search of "treed095" revealed it associated to a subject named Tymon D. Reed. Detective Breshears used a computer based investigative tool to search for Tymon D. Reed in the state of Missouri. There was only one result and it was for Tymon Derrick Reed, DOB 6/19/96, SSN 487-13-8932. Detective Breshears then searched the REJIS computer system for the same Tymon Derrick Reed, found the subject and contacted the MSHP to create a photo array that contained Tymon Derrick Reed. Detective Breshears showed the photo array to and he immediately selected photograph number five, which was Tymon Derrick Reed, and said he was the subject he knew from YMCA and Snap chat and he was the subject who had a gun and was confronting and shot the victim earlier in the day.
said he had heard from another student, were going to rob some weed off a guy. said he later found out the person they robbed was the Defendant. He said he knew this because the Defendant had told him, via Snap chat that he was looking for the later and another male because they had robbed him said around 1100 hours on 9/19/16 he received an inquiry from the Defendant on Snap chat asking if the later was at school. Said was not at school and he told the Defendant the same and did not hear from him again.
said after school he was around the BP gas station at 9935 E Truman Rd when he saw his friends, the victim, and walking across the street. He said the victim was already being approached by the Defendant as he walked to join them. said he thought the victim and the Defendant were going to fight but that the victim did not want to fight and was backing away from the Defendant. said as they continued to argue the Defendant backed the victim further north up Home Ave. said he heard the Defendant say to the victim, "Where's my shit at?" He said the Defendant then pulled a gun and pointed it at the victim who grabbed the gun in an attempt to take it away. said that only lasted one or two seconds and that the victim then turned to get away from the Defendant, who shot him as he was leaving. He said the victim fell down and then got up to continue moving away and the Defendant shot him again. He said the victim fell again, got up and the Defendant shot him again.
