COMPLAINT

Count I. Domestic Assault - 2nd Degree (565.073-003Y20171306.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.073, RSMo, committed the class D felony of domestic assault in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 558.002, RSMo, in that on or about January 28, 2017, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly caused physical injury to ██████. by striking ██████, and ██████ was a domestic victim in that she and the defendant had been in a continuing social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature.

Count II. Unlawful Use Of Weapon - Subsection 4 - Exhibiting (571.030-010Y20175299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of in violation of Section 571.030.1(4), RSMo, committed the class E felony of unlawful use of a weapon, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011 and 558.002, RSMo, in that on or about January 28, 2017, at 10407 East 78th Terrace, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant knowingly exhibited, in the presence of one or more persons, a .22 caliber Walther semi-automatic pistol, a weapon readily capable of lethal use, in an angry or threatening manner.

Count III. Unlawful Possession Of A Firearm (571.070-001Y20175212.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.070, RSMo, committed the class D felony of unlawful possession of a concealable firearm, punishable under Sections 558.011 and 558.002, RSMo, in that on or about January 28, 2017, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant was convicted of the felony of possession of a controlled substance in Lafayette County, Missouri, in case number 05LF-CR01323-01.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

Probable Cause Statement Form

Date: 01-28-2017

I, Detective Jeremy Riddle, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true.

I have probable cause to believe that on 01-28-2017, at 10407 East 78th Terrace, Raytown, Jackson County, MO, 64138, Myron T. Woods, black male, 03-10-1975, [REDACTED] committed one or more criminal offense(s).

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 01-28-2017, at about 0411 hours, Officer Abygail Shockley responded to 10411 East 78th Street Raytown, Jackson County, Missouri, in regard to a disturbance. Officer Shockley contacted [REDACTED] a black female born [REDACTED] who was covered with blood. Officers also observed a handgun, covered in apparent blood, on the porch of 10407 East 78th Terrace.

[REDACTED] told Officer Shockley that Myron Woods had assaulted her at 10407 East 78th Terrace and that she had fled to 10411 East 78th Terrace. [REDACTED] told Officer Shockley that Mr. Woods was possibly armed. Officer attempted to make contact at 10407 East 78th Terrace with negative results. Officers observed someone moving inside of the residence at 10407 East 78th Terrace and found that all of the doors were locked.

[REDACTED] was transported by Raytown EMS to Research Medical Center where she was treated for a concussion and lacerations on her head, face, and top lip. Officer Shockley also responded to Research Medical Center to continue her interview with [REDACTED] told Officer Shockley that she had known Mr. Woods for approximately five years and that she regularly had sex with him in exchange for drugs. [REDACTED] stated Mr. Woods had picked her up from her residence and driven her to 10407 East 78th Terrace. She stated that she and Mr. Woods had consensual sex at the residence and that she had used cocaine and Mr. Woods had smoked PCP.

[REDACTED] said when they were finished having sex she was ready to go home, but Mr. Woods refused to take her. She stated Mr. Woods got up and got a glass of water from the kitchen. Mr. Woods offered her the water, but she believed Mr. Woods "put something in it," so she refused to drink it. [REDACTED] said that she told Mr. Woods to drink it. [REDACTED] stated Mr. Woods drank the water and began "acting crazier." [REDACTED] said Mr. Woods began to become irate that she didn't drink the water. [REDACTED] stated Mr. Woods grabbed a pistol that was lying on top of the dresser in the bedroom, pointed the pistol at her, and told her, "Lay down so I can fuck you." [REDACTED] stated that she refused, which caused Mr. Woods to become irate. [REDACTED] stated that Mr. Woods struck her in the face, with his closed fists, which caused her to fall to the ground. She stated Mr. Woods then pulled her hair and continued to hit her. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] then began striking her on the head and face with the butt of the pistol, which caused her face to severely bleed.

[REDACTED] stated she was able to get the gun out of Mr. Wood's hands, due to it being covered in blood and, "slippery." [REDACTED] stated that once she had the gun, she fired several shots at Mr. Woods. [REDACTED] believed she struck Mr. Woods in the neck with a bullet.

[REDACTED] told Officer Shockley that she fired all of the bullets in the gun. She stated that Mr. Woods said "that's ok, I'll shoot you with the other gun." [REDACTED] said the gun fell out of her hand, due to all

of the blood, and Mr. Woods picked it up. She stated that Mr. Woods pointed the gun at her head and attempted to fire it. [REDACTED] stated that when the gun failed to fire Mr. Woods began striking her with the gun again [REDACTED] stated that she ran to the front door, but was not able to unlock it to get out. She stated that Mr. Woods again began to strike her face and head. [REDACTED] stated that she, "grabbed his nuts," which caused Mr. Woods to drop the gun. [REDACTED] stated that she picked up the gun and ran out the back door of the residence.

Detective Riddle responded to 10411 East 78th Terrace and recovered the gun, a pink .22 caliber Walther semi-automatic pistol, from the porch. Detective Riddle observed that the gun was completely covered in apparent dried blood. He also observed the slide was locked in the open position and that the magazine was empty and still in the gun.


Sgt. Gary Davis activated the Raytown Police Department's SWAT team, at approximately 0635 hours, in regard to Mr. Woods being barricaded, and possibly armed, in the residence. Detective Josh Wildman obtained a search warrant for 10407 East 78th Terrace.

At approximately 0920 hours, after numerous failed attempts to reach Mr. Woods by telephone, Raytown SWAT officers breached the door of the residence in an attempt to deliver a "throw phone." Mr. Woods immediately closed the door from the inside. SWAT officers then breached a front window and delivered the phone, which Mr. Woods immediately threw back out of the window. SWAT officers apprehended Mr. Woods, just inside the front door, at approximately 0928 hours. Officers discovered that Mr. Woods had an apparent gunshot wound to the right side of his chest, as well as injuries to his left hand and the left side of his head. Mr. Woods was transported to Research Medical Center by Raytown EMS, where he was treated and released. Mr. Woods was then transported to Raytown Police Headquarters.


Detectives entered 10407 East 78th Terrace and observed apparent blood throughout the first floor. Detectives recovered four .22 caliber shell casings, four live .22 caliber rounds, and a .45 caliber round with apparent blood on it. Detectives also recovered apparent PCP, heroin, and cocaine from the residence.

A computer check of Mr. Wood's criminal history showed him to have felony convictions in 1994, 1995, 2003, 2004 and 2006. Specifically, on November 6, 2006, the defendant was convicted of the felony of possession of a controlled substance in Lafayette County, Missouri, in case number 05LF-CR01323-01.

Detective Riddle contacted Mr. Woods, in the Detention Unit at Police Headquarters, and escorted him to an Interview Room at about 1415 hours. Detective Riddle advised Mr. Woods of his Miranda rights and asked Mr. Woods if he was willing to answer questions regarding the incident. Mr. Woods refused to speak to Detective Riddle without an attorney.
