COMPLAINT

Count I. Murder 2nd Degree (565.021-001Y19840903.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.021, RSMo, committed the class A felony of murder in the second degree, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about on or about June 9, 2017, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant acting alone or in concert with others knowingly or with the purpose of causing serious physical injury to Rebecca Murphy caused the death of Rebecca Murphy by shooting her.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about June 9, 2017, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of murder in the second degree charged in

State vs. Kevin B. Fenwick

Count I, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of murder in the second degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years.

Count III. Assault 1st Degree Or Attempt - Serious Physical Injury Or Special Victim (565.050-001Y19841399.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.050, RSMo, committed the class A felony assault in the first degree, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about on or about June 9, 2017, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant attempted to cause serious physical injury to and attempted to kill by shooting him, and in the course therrof defendant inflicted serious physical injury on

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count IV. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the felony of armed criminal action, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about June 9, 2017, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant committed the felony of Assault in the First Degree charged in Count 1, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of Assault in the First Degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

I, Detective Richard A. Berger #95, of the Jackson County, Missouri Sheriff's Office, knowing that false statements on this form are punishable by law, state that the facts contained herein are true:

- I have probable cause to believe that on 06/09/17, at 12820 S. Buckner Tarsney Rd., Lone Jack, Missouri, which is inside the boundaries of Jackson County, Missouri, Kevin B. Fenwick, B/M, 06/09/89, SSN:490-02-8144, last known address: 319 E. Bellevista Dr., Independence, MO, committed one or more criminal offense(s).
- 2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 06/09/17, at approximately 0624 hours, Jackson County Sheriff's Office Deputies were dispatched to the area of US50 Hwy., and Buckner Tarsney Rd., in regard to a shooting. The address was later determined to be 12820 S. Buckner Tarsney Rd., Lone Jack, MO. Initial information indicated a man had flagged down a passing motorist, and told her he had been shot, and his girlfriend was inside the home. After Deputies arrived on scene, they contacted EMS personnel, who were treating the man for a gunshot wound to the chest. The man was identified as

Deputy C. Cole then contacted the motorist who was flagged down by motorist told Deputy Cole that she saw a white male waving his arms in the air, as he was coming out of the wood line. The motorist said the man had blood on his left chest area, and right side. The motorist pulled her vehicle over to the shoulder of the road, and contacted who asked her to take him to the next exit. The motorist dialed 911, and told dispatch personnel he was kidnapped, and they shot him. When asked who did this to him, gave the name "Danielle Bell", of 1623 Lister Ave., Kansas City, MO. also said Bell was with two black males, and all three were armed with semi-automatic weapons.

Dispatch conducted a computer check of Bell, and found an address associated to her of 6005 E. 10th street, Kansas City, MO. Officers from the Kansas City, MO Police Department responded to the residence, and due to conflicting information, believed they were looking for a black in color Mazda, and a female by the name of "Lorraine", which is Bell's middle name. Officers checked the license of a black Lincoln parked at the home, which came back registered to Bell. Bell was contacted on scene, however due to the conflicting information, cleared the call, having believed Bell was not there. After realizing the error, the Officers attempted to re-contact the female, but after returning to the residence, the vehicle was gone. The Officers then provided the Sheriff's Office with the updated vehicle information.

Dispatch personnel for the Sheriff's Office then confirmed Bell to have a black, 2007 Lincoln registered to her. A BOLO was then issued for a 2007 black Lincoln MKZ, MO license DP0Y6G, believed to be occupied by a Danielle Bell. The BOLO also read Bell may be accompanied by two black males.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

After the arrival of several more Deputies, the home was cleared, in an attempt to locate additional suspects and/or victims. While clearing the home, a female, later identified as Rebecca L. Murphy, W/F, 07/31/87, was found in a room of the home, lying on the floor. Prairie Township Fire Chief Large, paramedic Perilla, and Lone Jack Fire Chief Kelsey were escorted inside the home, to assess the female, who was determined to be deceased. The woman appeared to have suffered from multiple gunshot wounds. A search warrant was executed on the home, and located inside were five (5) spent, 9mm caliber, Hornady brand, brass cartridge casings. In addition to the casings, four (4) copper jacketed lead slugs were located in the same room as the deceased female.

Having known the two addresses associated to Danielle Bell, (6005 E. 10th St., Kansas City, and 1623 Lister Ave., Kansas City), Deputies conducted surveillance on the two addresses. Deputies observed the Lincoln pass the 1623 Lister address, and conducted a felony car stop in regard. The vehicle was occupied by a Danielle L. Bell, W/F, 09/28/97 (Driver) Kevin B. Fenwick, B/M 06/09/89, (Front passenger) and Raphael R. Corrioso, B/M 10/23/93. (Left rear passenger) Bell was taken into custody and placed on a 24 hour investigative hold. Corrioso was transported to the Sheriff's Office for a formal interview, and Fenwick was released pending further investigation.

The vehicle, a 2007 Lincoln MKZ, was transported to the Sheriff's Office lot, and placed on a police hold. A search warrant was obtained for the Lincoln, and located inside were seven (7) live rounds of the same caliber and brand (9mm Hornady, brass cased) as the spent casing located in the home where the body of Rebecca Murphy was found.

In a formal interview with Corrioso, he said he was with Bell, Fenwick, and Murphy at 6005 E. 10th St., Kansas City, MO, when Bell confronted about his plan to rob her. Corrioso said didn't deny that he was planning on robbing Bell, but there wasn't a disturbance, nor were any of the individuals acting hostile. Bell told and Murphy to get in her car, and along with Fenwick and himself, got in Bell's car, and they drove somewhere out in the county.

Corrioso said they all went into an abandoned house, and while inside, Bell and Fenwick were confronting about his intentions to rob Bell. Corrioso said Fenwick displayed a handgun and asked Bell what she wanted to do, to which Bell did not reply. Fenwick raised up his right hand, which had a firearm in it, and shot and Murphy. Corrioso believed six (6) shots were fired.

On 06/10/17, it was learned had partially recovered from his injuries, and was able to give a more detailed statement regarding the incident. In an audio interview with said he was at Danielle Bell's sister's home, (6005 E. 10th St., Kansas City, MO) at about 4:00 AM on 06/16/17. said that Bell arrived at the residence, in the black Lincoln, and was accompanied by two black males, one smaller, and the other described as tall, light skinned, and was referred to as "Kev".
