COMPLAINT

Count I. Assault 1st Degree Or Attempt (565.050-002Y19791399.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.050, RSMo, committed the **class B felony of assault in the first degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about April 6, 2018, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant while operating a motor vehicle, purposely drove her vehicle toward the officer's vehicle in an attempt to strike that vehicle, and such conduct was a substantial step toward the commission of the crime of attempting to cause serious physical injury to PO , and was done for the purpose of committing such assault.

The range of punishment for a class B felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than five (5) years and not to exceed fifteen (15) years.

Count II. Resisting Arrest/detention/stop By Fleeing - Creating A Substantial Risk Of Serious Injury/death To Any Person (575.150-002Y20174801.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 575.150, RSMo, committed the **class E felony of resisting a lawful stop**, punishable upon conviction under Sections 558.002 and 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about April 6, 2018, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, PO , a law enforcement officer, was attempting to

make a lawful stop of defendant, and the defendant knew or reasonably should have known that the officer was making a lawful stop, and, for the purpose of preventing the officer from effecting the stop, resisted the stop of defendant by fleeing from the officer and defendant fled in such a manner that created a substantial risk of serious physical injury or death to other persons in that defendant drove eastbound in the westbound lanes of 7 Highway, putting other drivers who were on the roadway at risk.

The range of punishment for a class E felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than two (2) years and not to exceed four (4) years; or by imprisonment for a special term not to exceed one (1) year in the county jail or other authorized penal institution; or by a fine not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000); or by both imprisonment and a fine. If money or property has been gained through the commission of the crime, any fine imposed may be not more than double the amount of the offender's gain from the commission of the crime.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.

Wherefore, the Prosecuting Attorney prays that an arrest warrant be issued as provided by law.

I, a Police Officer with the Lone Jack Police Department, Upon my oath, and under the penalties of perjury, state as follows:

- 1. I have probable cause to believe that, the Suspects, Shoop, Kortney M., W/F, DOB: 12/30/1990; did commit one or more criminal offenses.
- 2. The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 04-06-2018 at approximately 2234 hours, I was on patrol in the area of WB 50 Hwy and Buckner Tarsney Rd., Lone Jack, Jackson County, Missouri, when I observed the suspect vehicle, a white Oldsmobile SUV, license place number, PP2 Y9H, passed my location with a broken left rear tail light.

As I attempted to conduct a traffic stop on the vehicle, it accelerated leading myself and eventually several officers from several different agencies in a pursuit. The pursuit lasted approximately 90 minutes and went through Jackson, Johnson and Cass Counties. During the pursuit, the driver of the vehicle later identified as Kortney Shoop, drove the vehicle the wrong up the WB 50 Highway exit ramp and then proceeded eastbound in the westbound lanes of 50 Highway. There were other vehicles on the roadway at this time.

During an attempt to box the suspect vehicle in to force a stop, the driver of the vehicle swerved at my patrol vehicle in an attempt to strike my vehicle.

The suspect then turned onto Buckner-Tarsney and then onto Colbern Road. While on Colbern Road, I saw shots being fired at me coming from the passenger side of the vehicle. I also observed during the pursuit that items were being thrown from the passenger side of the vehicle. A search of the area after the pursuit revealed several firearms and a bag of projectile parts of ammunition. Numerous spent shell casings were recovered from inside the vehicle on the front passenger floorboard and the back passenger floorboard. There were also several live rounds found throughout the vehicle.

Officers used spike strips to stop the vehicle. The vehicle became inoperable and the suspects were taken into custody. Suspects were identified by their fingerprints by Missouri State Highway Patrol.

The driver, Shoop was transported to the hospital after she stated that she had ingested heroin and Xanax.

Sgt. Greg Martin of The Missouri State Highway Patrol, interviewed one of the passengers identified as Hunter Fanara. Fanara stated he was in the vehicle but there were never any shots fired from the vehicle or firearms in the vehicle.

Count I. Assault 1st Degree Or Attempt - Serious Physical Injury Or Special Victim (565.050-001Y19841399.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 565.050, RSMo, committed the **class A felony of attempted assault in the first degree**, punishable upon conviction under Section 558.011, RSMo, in that on or about April 6, 2018, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or purposely in concert with another, shot at and such conduct was a substantial step toward the commission of the offense of assault in the first degree of a law enforcement officer performing his duties and special victim, and was done for the purpose of committing such assault.

An individual convicted and sentenced for this offense shall not be eligible for parole until eighty-five percent of the sentence is served.

The range of punishment for a class A felony is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than ten (10) years and not to exceed thirty (30) years, or life imprisonment.

Count II. Armed Criminal Action (571.015-001Y19755299.0)

The Prosecuting Attorney of the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, upon information and belief, charges that the defendant, in violation of Section 571.015, RSMo, committed the **felony of armed criminal action**, punishable upon conviction under Section 571.015.1, RSMo, in that on or about April 6, 2018, in the County of Jackson, State of Missouri, the defendant, either acting alone or purposefully in concert with another, committed the felony of attempted assault in the first degree charged in Count one, all allegations of which are incorporated herein by reference, and the defendant committed the foregoing felony of assault in the first degree by, with and through, the knowing use, assistance and aid of a deadly weapon.

The range of punishment for the offense of Armed Criminal Action in violation of section 571.015 RSMo. is imprisonment in the custody of the Missouri Department of Corrections for a term of years not less than three (3) years without eligibility for parole, probation, conditional release or suspended imposition or execution of sentence for a period of three (3) calendar years. Any punishment imposed pursuant to section 571.015 RSMo. shall be in addition to any punishment provided by law for the crime committed by, with, or through the use, assistance, or aid of a dangerous instrument or deadly weapon.

The facts that form the basis for this information and belief are contained in the attached statement(s) of facts, made a part hereof and submitted as a basis upon which this court may find the existence of probable cause.
